

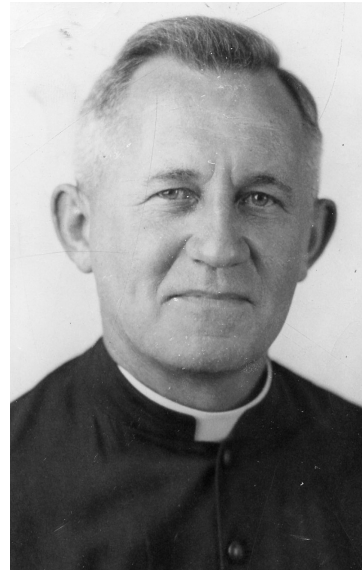

Bro Gregory (Ladislaus) Rozczynialski, C.S.C.

born: 21 February 1892

died: 28 July 1962



Gregory was born in Chicago and attended Holy Trinity parish school. He joined Holy Cross when he was just fourteen and went to the juniorate, which was located then at Old College at Notre Dame. He went to the novitiate and pronounced his first vows in 1909. His first assignment was to teach at his former school, Holy Trinity. He began his college studies and earned his bachelor of science degree at Notre Dame in 1924. He taught math and science at many community schools: in Evansville, Fort Wayne, Terre Haute, Watertown, Portland, Austin and New Orleans. Gregory spent a number of summer sessions studying at Loyola, DePaul and Notre Dame where he earned a master's degree in 1932. He often worked with Father Nieuwland, the famous chemist and botanist, both in the laboratory and on field trips. He also enjoyed many camping expeditions and canoe trips with his good friend, Father Cornelius Haggerty. Outside of his teaching responsibilities, he was often in charge of sports programs in nearly every school. Gregory was a man of few words, one who preferred to listen rather than talk. He died suddenly from a heart attack at Holy Cross in New Orleans.
