

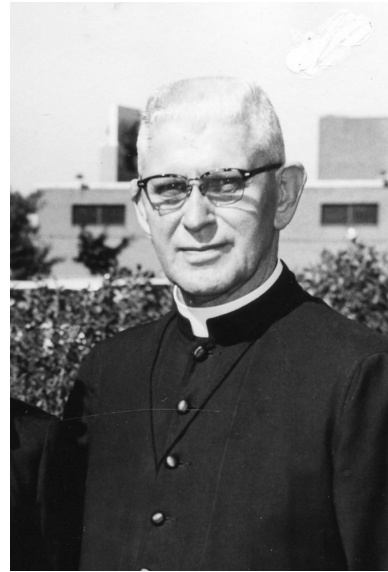

Brother Arthur (Joseph) Bouvier, C.S.C.

born: 23 February 1886

died: 10 February 1970



Arthur was born in Val-D'ize, France and entered the community there. He came to the United States when France expelled all religious personnel in 1904. He received the habit at the novitiate at Notre Dame that year and made final vows in 1912. He was stationed at Holy Cross High in New Orleans where he taught French and penmanship. While there, he always preferred to drink "cistern water and not city water." He also taught at St. Edward's High School in Austin, Holy Trinity in Chicago and at the University of Portland. He was assigned to Columba Hall in 1963. He had a number of idiosyncrasies and suffered with a variety of physical and psychological problems for many years.
