## **Brother Albert (Ernest) Pinter, C.S.C.**

*born: 16 November 1919*

*died: 2 September 1982*



Albert was born in Cleveland, Ohio, attended West Technical High there. He worked in carpentry at a firm in Cleveland and entered Holy Cross when he went to Watertown in the spring of 1940. He went on to the novitiate in Rolling Prairie where he made first vows in the summer of 1941. He studied at Notre Dame, earned a bachelor's degree in 1946, and continued graduate studies during summer schools. His first teaching assignment was to Cathedral High in 1946 where he taught for 5 years. He then taught for 7 years at Boysville in Clinton, another 8 years at Cathedral High and then 3 years at St. Joseph's High in South Bend. He taught at Benton Harbor High in Michigan for 4 years and also Marquette High School in Michigan City. In 1975 he returned to Boysville where he served on the faculty and staff for 7 years. Albert was skilled in teaching industrial arts, a field that led to influencing the careers of many of his students.
