

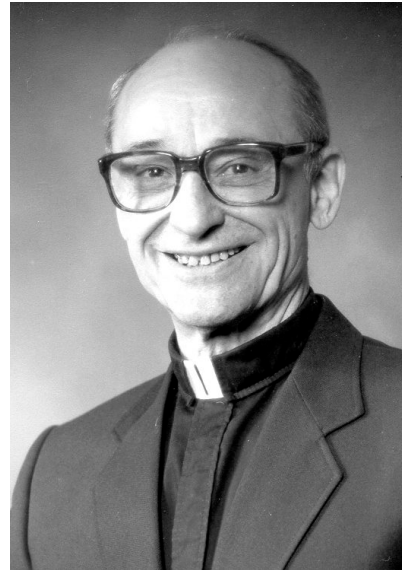

Brother Armand (Theodore) Amman, C.S.C.

born: 4 September 1913

died: 25 July 1992



Armand was born in Maple Grove, Michigan and attended schools there. He entered Holy Cross after high school, going to the juniorate in Watertown in 1932 and then the novitiate at Notre Dame. He made his first vows in 1934. He went to Gibault School and worked there for the next 16 years as farm director, steward, teacher, and prefect of the junior department. He served at another boys' home in Chatsworth, California and then studied at St. Edward's University, earning his bachelor's degree in 1957. He returned to Gibault as the superior and director for 4 years and then served on the faculties at Monroe, Evansville, Gilmour and River Grove for the next 16 years. He studied at Loyola Medical Center in 1977, and earned the units to be a hospital chaplain. He worked in hospitals in Saginaw, Michigan, Kansas City, and at Memorial Hospital in South Bend, tending and caring for patients for 10 years. He retired to Columba Hall in 1988. His concern and care for the sick in hospitals as chaplain must have provided him with satisfaction in helping those who were in need.
