

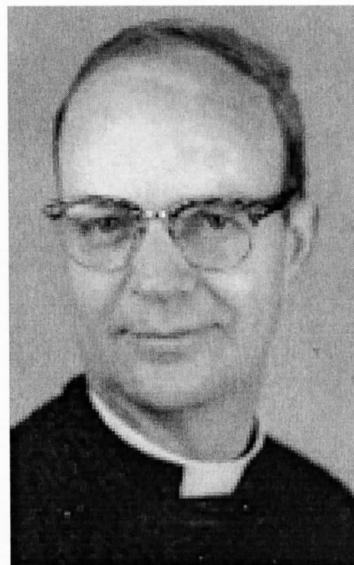

Brother Maynard (Raymond) Rabidoux, C.S.C.

born: 29 April 1914

died: 8 September 2001



Maynard was born in Bay City, Michigan and attended schools there. He worked for a wholesale grocery and at Chevrolet before entering Holy Cross at Watertown in 1938. He studied at the University of Notre Dame. Since he was a meticulous specialist in commercial and clerical tasks, he was assigned to the staff of the Notre Dame Bookstore for 3 years. He then worked in the auditor's office at the University for 3 years, and for 2 years he was on the staff of the provincial treasurer's office at Columba Hall. In 1948 he became a staff member at Gibault School, and served there for 18 years. In 1966 he helped the staff in the the treasurer's office at Gilmour Academy until 1974. For the next 15 years, he was on the faculty of Catholic Central High in Monroe. He then served on the staff of Holy Cross High in River Grove for 10 years until he retired in 1969. Whether it was in his prayerful living or fulfilling his duties wherever he was employed, Maynard approached everything with scrupulous fidelity and intensity. His good humor and cheerful spirit were characteristic of his way of life in Holy Cross.
