

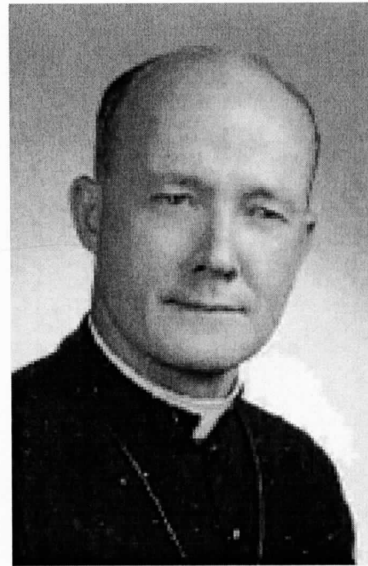

**Brother Liguori (Clarence) Denier, C.S.C.**

*born: 9 March 1907*

*died: 15 March 2002*



Liguori was born in Cincinnati and joined the Brothers in Watertown in 1928. After completing studies at Notre Dame in 1933, he spent 4 years teaching in Indianapolis, Watertown, and Chicago. He then became a missionary and was assigned to East Bengal (Bangladesh) where he taught for 17 years at St. Gregory's High in Dacca and Holy Cross High in Bandura. He returned to the U.S. in 1955 and taught at Holy Cross High School in Flushing. He next taught at St. Edward High in Lakewood for 3 years. He joined the faculty at Cathedral in Indianapolis and then taught at Hoban High in Akron. He returned to St. Edward to teach for 7 years. He taught for 6 years at Holy Trinity in Chicago. He retired from teaching in 1977 and did pastoral care work at Chicago's Nazareth Hospital. He retired at Columba Hall in 1990. Liguori was a precise and demanding teacher. His years in Bangladesh formed him into a generous, self-motivated, patient, and determined man. He participated in the charismatic prayer movement as one of the creative thinkers in the post-Vatican II theology.
