Raymond was born in Chicago and attended schools in Niagara Falls, Canada. In 1950 he entered the program at Watertown. After profession, his first ministry was as a cook at Dujarie Hall, then Vincent Hall in Austin, and Columba Hall. He took a position at the Ave Maria Press for 3 years and then in 1959 joined the first staff of Archbishop Hoban High in Akron where he served for 9 years. He was moderator of the Mothers' Club, architect of sets for musical productions, and landscaper of the grounds. In 1968 he moved to Holy Cross High in River Grove for 7 years and worked in the same roles as at Akron. Beginning in 1975, he took on new challenges in helping with senior centers in Chicago as a staff member for 7 years. He lived at Holy Trinity High School and helped with the bingo games, which were a major source of income for the school. He also did volunteer work with the Senior Friendship Center in Florida. He was the manager of Mercy House in Venice for 6 years. In 2002, his health condition brought him back to Notre Dame, but he managed to do yeoman work and cared for St. Joseph Cemetery. When his mother died, he proposed that a bronze statue of Brother Andre be commissioned in her honor and paid for by the family. That statue stands in the courtyard of Schubert Villa.
