I first encountered the Brothers of Holy Cross when I enrolled at St. Edward High School in 1964. There were 38 brothers at the school and it was clear they were in charge and setting the tone. Over the course of my four years there, I was fairly involved in co-curriculars, with band and stage crew being the most dominant. My academic work was about average, and most told me I was underperforming. But I liked it there and spent a lot of time at school with a variety of school activities. There was something I wanted to be a part of, and the brothers were those most involved in all those activities. I was impressed enough that as senior year came, I started thinking about being a brother so that I could do for future students what the brothers were doing for me and my classmates. We were a community of 1,700 very different boys with, to me, very different interests, abilities and backgrounds, but we were a

family who was working toward the same overall goals – a good education with good experiences in an atmosphere that was caring, positive, affirming, challenging and enjoyable.

Today, we have names for that experience that the brothers just did naturally – creating a culture that was based on relationships with respect and understanding as core. But it no longer just happens because of how many brothers are there. The culture is created by a group of committed lay teachers and staff members that we call Holy Cross Educators.

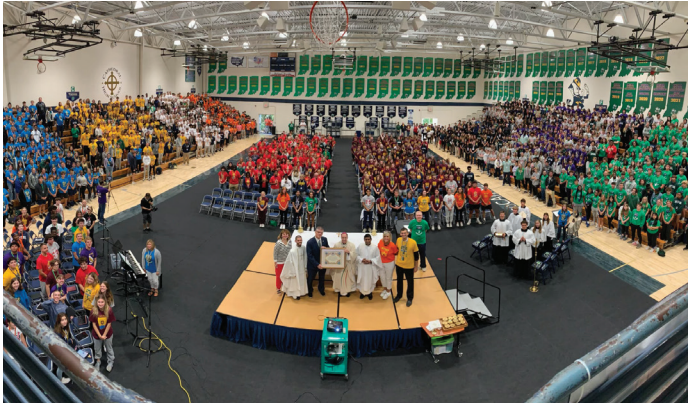

Schools purposefully impart Holy Cross values continued

In the 1980's I was working at the brothers' school in Chicago. When I arrived in 1976 there were 20 brothers. After I left in 1995, there were six brothers. Today there is one part-time volunteer, but we are still doing things the "brothers' way" and we have decided to be intentional about it – to have

names for what we do and how we do it. For the most part this was originally coming from our brothers in the Southwest part of the U. S., but many of us in the Midwest were adopting the charism, values and language and making it our own. Those who worked with the brothers in our Holy Cross schools did not want to lose what they saw as special from the brothers, even though some of our schools had few or no active brothers. We had discovered the charism, mission, values and traditions of the brothers were actually found in some of the

original writing of our founder, Blessed Basil Moreau, and they were expanded and illuminated in the Constitutions of the Congregation of Holy Cross that were approved in the mid 1980's. We identified the behaviors, used variations on Moreau's own words to name and describe them, and created a way to preserve what we considered a unique school culture called Holy Cross.

At this time every Holy Cross school in the U.S. has identified their unique way of doing things and called them core values, charisms, pillars and such. Though there are some differences, a loose reading will demonstrate how similar we are in what is held as important to preserve our Holy Cross identity. I hope you will be inspired by how a sampling of our students have internalized these values in their lives. A Holy Cross education is special, and we are very blessed, very blessed indeed, that so many dedicated and inspired people have become true partners in preserving the 'brothers' way, as Holy Cross educators. Language and structures are in place for a long future guided by the Providence of God as we continue to be Holy Cross.

Thank you for all you do to continue to support us and our ministries.

This spring over 1,100 young men and women graduated from the six Holy Cross schools of the Midwest Province. Each student was well-versed in the traditions of Holy Cross and the core values, charisms and pillars unique to their school. 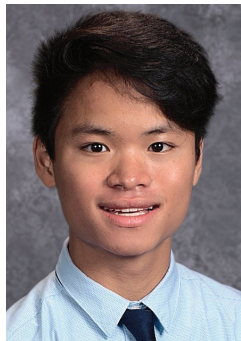

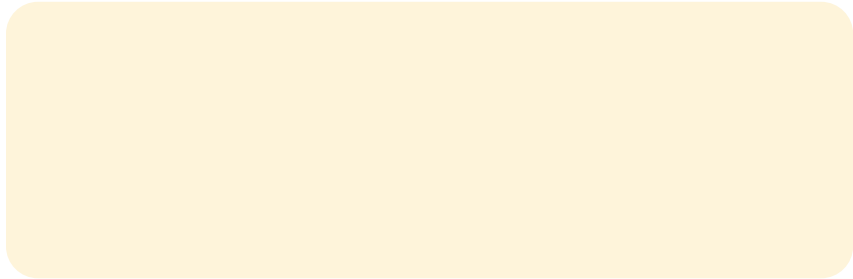
