Charles was born in Akron, attended St. Paul's Elementary and St. Mary's High School. He studied at the University of Akron graduating with a degree in Education in 1962. He taught for 4 years in Akron public schools. He followed a calling to join Holy Cross and entered the juniorate at Holy Cross Junior College in 1966, went to the novitiate and made his first vows in 1968. He taught at St. Joseph's High in South Bend for 5 years. He attended summer schools at Notre Dame and earned a master's degree in 1973. He then taught at Holy Trinity in Chicago, Archbishop Hoban, and Memorial High in Evansville. He worked in youth ministry for a year and then joined the faculty at Bishop David High in Louisville for 12 years. He was a popular and enthusiastic English teacher. Many former students would ask for help in their courses at the University of Louisville. In the summers he took graduate courses in Library Science to earn a master's degree in 1988. He became the librarian at Holy Cross College, enthusiastically serving for 12 years. He retired and became the administrative assistant for the provincial and was a substitute teacher at Marian High. He often volunteered with other brothers to serve in the soup kitchen at St. Augustine's parish. He taught courses in the Forever Learning Center and assisted in Alcoholics Anonymous meetings. He often served as the master of ceremonies at community functions and was a generous and thoughtful assistant superior of Schubert Villa and Dujarie House in Holy Cross Village.
