The Holy See has granted permission for canonical erection of a novitiate of the Brothers of Holy Cross at St. John School, Ghana, West Africa.

Superiors and Principals of the province's five boarding schools met at Holy Cross Junior College from May 3rd to 5th to discuss staffing, curriculum, training and in-service programs, future plans, and finances. Brother Thomas Shaughnessy, Social Service Director at Father Gibault School for Boys, was elected chairman of an ad hoc committee, composed of one representative from each boarding school, which will meet early in June to continue discussion of the boarding school apostolate.

A workshop for heads of the religion departments in province schools, plus one other representative from each religion department, is scheduled for September 13th to 15th. Brother Roy Nash is chairman. Further information concerning the workshop will be forthcoming, as will information from the secretariat established during the summer months at the provincial house to collate data on the evaluation of province schools and institutions (cf. appropriate Provincial Chapter decree of the Committee on the Educational Apostolate).

On June 2nd the Provincial, Brother Donatus, leaves South Bend for Europe and the General Chapter. He sails from New York on the S.S. Michelangelo in company with Brothers John Baptist Titzer, Provincial, Charles Krupp, Raymond Fleck, and Robert Hampton. It has been learned that some Canadian capitulants will, by chance, be on the same ship.

A new phase of province history begins on June 15th when novices of the Midwest Province begin novitiate training at Basil Hall, Holy Cross Junior College. Brother Thomas Dillman is the new Director of Novices.

Francis Walker, a freshman at St. Joseph's High School, South Bend, plays the lead, with Brothers of the scholasticate making up the rest of the cast, musical ensembles, and production staff.
