At the December meeting of the three Brother Provincials, a proposal was made to establish a ten-day program which would be called a "Workshop in Contemporary Religious Life." The program is intended for those Brothers who have been working in the apostolate for at least eight to ten years and who feel a need for becoming better acquainted with the direction in which the Church and the religious life is moving. Each workshop will be an inter-province undertaking and will be limited to twenty-five religious, approximately eight from each province.

Brother Stephen Walsh (SW), Brother Joseph Mannoni (E) and Brother Rex Henneel (MW) have been named to organize the program. The dates have been set for June 21-30, August 3-12, and August 17-26. The faculty for the workshops will be individuals experienced in their discipline; they will not necessarily be community members, although some may be.

If anyone in the Midwest Province, who has been in the apostolate eight to ten years or more, is interested in participating in any one of these workshops, please inform Brother Rex of this interest.

The three workshops planned for this summer will not be the only ones; it may be possible to conduct a few during the school year, but much depends upon the success of the summer programs. Therefore, if circumstances eventually prevent your participation this summer, there will be opportunities later on.

These programs are intended to be part of the overall plan of the three provinces to establish an on-going "continuing formation policy". Of course, any project, regardless of its type, depends upon the good will and cooperation of those interested. You are asked to keep the project in your prayers.

Brother Thomas Corcoran suffered a possible heart attack on February 26 at Holy Cross High School, River Grove. He is presently in the intensive-care ward of West Suburban Hospital.

The Provincial Council has accepted the resignations of Brother William Fitch as principal of Archbishop Hoban High School, and Brother Richard Reaume as principal of Bishop David High School.
