Brother Albert Kern has been named Assistant Provincial Steward, replacing Brother Alcuin Nuss who died in July. Brother Caius Webber fills the vacancy resulting from Brother Albert's elevation to his new office.

Gilmour Academy has arranged for an exchange of teachers with Canterbury School, New Milford, Connecticut, an outstanding Catholic preparatory school run by Catholic laymen. This year, Brother James Gleeson is teaching theology at Canterbury, and one of the faculty from Canterbury has joined the English Department at Gilmour.

Brother Jeffrey Michels has been released from a province assignment to assist the Diocese of Detroit this year. He is serving as principal of St. Martin's High School, an inner-city school on Detroit's East Side.

The Provincial Administration has been requested to release Brother Joseph Berg from his position as Director of St. Charles Boys Home so that he can assume an administrative position with the National Conference of Catholic Charities in Washington, D. C. Efforts are underway to make Brother Joseph's release possible and to arrange for the appointment of a Director at St. Charles to replace Brother Joseph.
