The schools are still closed, but unhampered. Telephone service was restored this morning. Mail service may follow soon."

Robert Harris, a candidate living at Archbishop Hoban High School, Akron, has returned home. His father died recently.

Brother Chester Rachel, who had been in the States for his mother's funeral, left April 16 to return to Ghana.

Brothers Peter N ault and Terence Muehlenkamp made their final profession on April 17 at St. Edward's High School chapel.

Brother Barry Lambour, Regional Superintendent of Catholic Schools for Summit County, Akron, Ohio, has asked if there is anyone skilled in the organization of CCD programs who would be interested in summer work. Brother writes: "The individual would not necessarily have to be a CCD expert, but would find skills in organization, brochure development, possibly setting up a registrar's office, etc. of great use."
