St. Mary's College (Winona) SUMMER NOTES for July 15 had several items concerning the work of Brother John Miller. "A workshop on Media and Religious Education will be held this Saturday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. in the College Center. The workshop will be conducted by Brother John Miller, CSC, as a project for his youth culture class...Brother John will give the keynote address on How the Word Gets Around at 9 a.m. in room ABC...Brother John will be in the college center all day Sunday to discuss the presentation and re-screen films for anyone unable to attend the workshop." Another item notes: "David Conyik, summer graduate instructor of communication arts and teacher at Notre Dame High School, Niles, Illinois, is writing a textbook on film study in the high school curriculum. Brother John Miller is editing the book which will be published by the Saint Mary's College Press this December." A final item: "The movies this Friday night in St. Yon's will be SKY OVER HOLLAND and THE CARETAKER. Study guides on THE CARETAKER, prepared by Brother John Miller, CSC, will be available at the showing for anyone interested."

Brother Raymond Papenfuss wrote recently: "We have been having some terrible rains (in Ghana). A week ago it was so bad that two bridges went down and over a hundred yards of railway track was washed out. The small village below the school was almost completely washed out. Over 3,000 people are without homes in the Sekondi-Takoradi area. We were without water for six days. Since this is still early in the wet season we are holding our breath in hopes that we don't get very much more rain. The area has been declared a disaster area and there is much suffering...Brothers Norbert Ackon and Francis Hattoh have begun teaching in primary schools in the Cape Coast area. They finished their exams about two weeks ago. We wanted them to get a bit of experience teaching over this holiday season since it will be a long time before their examination results come out."

Robert Dailey, William Faiella, Kenneth Gill, Kenneth Haders, Robert Livernois, James Shedlock and James Van Dyke will enter Holy Cross Novitiate, Bennington, Vermont, on August 18 to begin their novitiate training.

The subcommittee on The Person and Community suggested development of a province-wide program for assisting in development of communication skills for province members at the June meeting of chapter committees. Brothers John Benesh, Robert Lavelle, and Edward Overstreet have been working on developing this program. They recently attended a workshop at Noroton, Connecticut, to aid them in their work. Six or seven province members will attend a workshop in St. Louis from August 6 to 8 to receive training which will assist them in working in the program when it become effective later this year.
