Brother Sigismund Danielski has taken up residence at St. Joseph's High School, South Bend.

Brother Richard Gilman wrote recently from Cape Coast: "The cholera has been very bad indeed. We've lost a few labourers to it but so far no student has been affected. The hospital here is full of cases and there have been many deaths. On Tuesday night there was a terrible crash in front of the school. Two taxis collided, and one ended up wrapped around a plum tree. I rushed out immediately and found two people thrown clear of the wreck, both seriously injured. I summoned the ambulance from the hospital and then went back to the scene. By then all the kids were out and Sammy (Mr. Sedo, the Headmaster) was also there. He and I pulled a woman out of the wreck, but she was dead. Altogether two died and three were seriously injured. One of our students died this week and one labourer fell victim to cholera." I would suggest that care be taken that the information concerning cholera not reach the parents of our Brothers in Ghana so as not to worry them needlessly. Our Brothers have been given shots and are not in serious danger. Please keep the poor people of Ghana in your prayers.

It has been decided to send our aspirants to the Eastern Province novitiate at Bennington, Vermont, probably in early September. They will join those from the other U.S. provinces. Brother Thomas Moser will join the novitiate staff.

Brother Charles has called a meeting of the chairmen of the chapter committees and sub-committees for February 6. He will present some considerations to meet current conditions in the province. The agenda for the scheduled June meeting will also be considered.

Brother Rex will leave on January 25 to make the visit in East Pakistan. He should be away about a month.

Brother Casper Molchan signed his dispensation papers on January 7.
