Father Patrick Sullivan, CSC, Director of Personnel Services for Holy Cross Priests, has informed us that Christopher Kuhn, a seminarian who will receive his degree from Notre Dame at the end of the first semester, would like to teach for one semester before going to the novitiate. His major field is history, and his secondary interests are social studies and theology. Father also says that he has been asked about possible openings in chemistry for the spring of 1972 and fall of 1972. We will forward information on interested persons to principals when it is received in our office.

Changes in assignments: Since the last edition of the NEWS NOTES, Brother Ligouri Denier has been assigned to Holy Trinity High School, Chicago; Brother James Blume has been reassigned to Teen Challenge Training and Growth Center, Perry, Ohio.

United States Senator William D. Proxmire will be the featured speaker at Gibault's Golden Anniversary Banquet on October 9. The banquet will be celebrating the golden anniversary of the school and the end of Phase I of the capital improvement fund drive. The total campaign goal is \$1,500,000 over the next five years, with Phase I having a goal of \$420,000.

Brother Robert Fillmore was elected Vice-Chairman of the Midwest Religious Vocation Directors Association at the annual convention last week. The organization represents approximately sixty-five religious vocation men working in the Midwest.

Brother Columba Curran attended the International Conference on Organometallic Chemistry in Moscow in August.

Several weeks ago, Pope Paul VI announced the promotion of Rev. Edward Heston, CSC, to the post of President of the Pontifical Commission for Social Communication. Father Heston had previously held the post of Secretary of the Congregation of Religious.

An error was made in the listing for Brother Paul Dittmer on the notice sent to the houses recently. I listed the apartment number as 210. It should have been 201.

Brother Edward Wauchter was awarded a certificate of excellence at the conclusion of a series of summer workshops for librarians at Carroll College. Only nineteen of the sixty-four participants were so honored.

In early September, the Ford Motor Company donated about one hundred and twenty acres of farm land to Boysville. The property adjoins the present Boysville site and is valued at over \$100,000. Five sisters from different religious communities are employed at Boysville this year and reside in one of the buildings on the recently donated property.....A new office building is scheduled for completion by November 15. This new facility will house the administrative, social service, accounts and general offices.....At a recent meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees authorized finalization of the engineering drawings for a new infirmary building. Construction on this facility is scheduled to begin in March 1973.

Representatives from all of the schools met at the Center on September 25 and 26 to consider vocation recruitment policies for the schools. The session concluded with the final profession of Brother Thomas Hodgkiss in the Center Chapel.
