At the conclusion of the District of West Africa district chapter, Brother Charles Krupp re-appointed Brother Raymond Papenfuss as District Superior. Brother Raymond will be assisted by the following council during his term: Brother Richard Gilman, Asst. Dist. Sup.; Brother Joseph Tsiquaye, Secretary; Brother David Naples, Steward; Brothers Philip Armstrong, Edward Foken and William Healy, Councilors. . . . During the chapter, Brother Philip Armstrong was elected as delegate to the 1973 provincial chapter.

Brother John Zoglmann has resigned as principal of St. Patrick's High School, Monrovia, and returned to the States where he will teach at Bishop David High School in Louisville. Brother Edward Foken has been named superior and principal at St. Patrick's to replace Brother John.

BOYSVILLE has expanded its child care services to include a drug program. The core group has been at Boysville for the past six months and is now moving to a home in Detroit. Brother Donald Kuchenmeister will be director of the Detroit home.

Brother Joseph Fox has been assigned to Cathedral High School, Indianapolis. He will replace Mrs. Wilhelm, who has resigned after nearly seven years as bookkeeper for the school. Brother Joseph will return to the Provincial Office at the end of June to continue his work there.

Brother Francisco Drury has been named librarian of the Life Science Library at the University of Notre Dame. Brother is living at Columba Hall.

The Midwest Province has sent a check for \$1,000 to assist with the relief work in Managua, Nicaragua, following the devastating earthquake which hit there several weeks ago.

The Midwest Province is cooperating with the five other U.S. provinces of Holy Cross priests and brothers and eleven other religious communities of men in a college vocation promotion effort being directed by the Paulist Press. This effort will acquaint more than 88,000 Catholic college students with Holy Cross by means of three different mailings. A representative

of the Paulist Press recently spent nearly a week in the Notre Dame area interviewing Holy Cross members and gathering information for the publications.

Brother Gerald Detamore has taken a position as Child Care Supervisor at Maryville Academy, 1150 North River Road, Des Plaines, Illinois 60016. The phone number for the Academy is (312) 824-6126. He begins work there January 29.

Brother Edwin Mattingly is currently negotiating a fifteen months contract with the U.S. Air Force, Kirtland Air Force Base, New Mexico, for training falcons to keep the runways of various air force bases clear of birds which could cause engine failure in jet aircraft. Part of the contract calls for training of personnel to handle the falcons. . . . Brother Edwin has also formed with two others the Ecological Information Service in Albuquerque, New Mexico. They have contracts with the Army Corps of Engineers to do five impact studies in New Mexico and Colorado. The studies will involve air, soil and water sampling studies on a regular basis, and reports will involve economic and social values as well as environmental considerations.

Brother Eric Landers has resumed teaching part-time, having recovered from the heart attack he suffered in the early fall. He will begin full-time teaching in the second semester. . . . Brother Gilbert Scher has come to Dujarie House for a prolonged period of recuperation. . . . Brother James Buckley has returned to Boysville where he is recuperating from his recent heart attack.

At the conclusion of the district chapter in West Africa, the entire community joined to celebrate the 25th anniversary of profession of Brother William Gates. Brother Charles Krupp, who had attended the chapter, represented the provincial administration.

About 400 priests, sisters and brothers gathered at the Province Center on the evening of January 20 for Vespers and a social hour to conclude the Moreau Day celebration in the Notre Dame Area. In the morning nearly 600 Holy Cross religious had gathered at Sacred Heart Church for Lauds and Mass, at which Archbishop Mark McGrath, Bishop of Panama, was celebrant and gave the homily. About 450 gathered at St. Mary's at noon for a delicious meal and then at O'Laughlin Auditorium for the audio-visual presentation on the life of Father Moreau which the Sisters had prepared. Other celebrations were held in Le Mans, Bangladesh, Africa, and various places in Canada and the United States as the sons and daughters of Father Moreau commemorated the 100th anniversary of his death.

Paul Clark received a dispensation from his vows and was married in Indianapolis on December 30 to a former school mate in Owensboro. They are residing in Indianapolis. . . .
