## FROM THE GENERALATE

On September 4, 1977, the remains of Father Dujarie will be transferred to the chapel of the Sisters of Providence, Ruille-sur-Loire. Father Barrosse and some members of the general council will participate in the ceremony. \*\*\* Fr. Barrosse is preparing a circular letter on celibacy. \*\*\* The proposed text for the new law on consecrated life has been officially released for study by superiors general and the hierarchy. The superiors general have been asked to study the text, consult others, and send their observations to the Union of Superiors General. The final report will be made to the Pontifical Commission working on the text by the end of the calendar year.

"A Psychospiritual Approach Towards Religious Formation," by Dr. William F. Kraft, Review for Religious, May, 1977.
