OF BROTHER FRANCIS MEDURI and GHANA


#Brother Francis Meduri writes that he recently completed a special assignment in the Sunyani, Ghana, diocese, by winding up his stint as administrator of the Catholic hospital at Nkoranza, a small town some distance from Sunyani.

Frank experienced many varieties of interesting and educational events during his months as administrator. He certainly learned more about searching for supplies of food, equipment and petrol, and, what is more important, securing such supplies for the hospital.

In the process, Frank continued to practice Twi, the local Ghanaian dialect, without which, he says, it is practically impossible to deal directly with the majority of people in the Sunyani area.

Still conscious of his role as Youth Minister in the Sunyani diocese even during his time as hospital administrator, Frank attempted to solidify the CYO program going in Nkoranza, as well as strengthen the organization on a diocesan level. Conditions in the country, however, militate against much activity apart from the very fundamental search for food and other basic needs.

Frank is now back full time in Sunyani with Brother Joe Tsiquaye working in Youth Ministry.
