Rex Hennel, Eduardo Michalik, Donald Allen** (the first three Holy Cross faculty members at St. John's School in Sekondi), and **Raymond Papenfuss**, former district superior. They returned to the U.S. on December 6 and 7.

The fall issue of *Notre Dame Magazine* carried an excellent lengthy article with accompanying photos about Holy Trinity High School in Chicago. "Beyond These Walls," was written by John McCormick, the Chicago bureau chief of Newsweek Magazine, whose material had been condensed and published in that periodical last June. The full article is highly complimentary of **Br. Philip Smith** and his administration, faculty and staff, and contains quotations from **Brs. Philip, Clement Burger,** and **Robert Fillmore.**

Br. Daniel Kane, holding down three part-time jobs last school year, has recently accepted a full-time position as a Home Health Care RN with the Benjamin Rose Institute, a Cleveland philanthropic foundation/agency that provides a variety of support services for older persons in their home environment.

In his leisure, Dan continues to pursue music composition, and he informs us that Abingdon Press of Nashville has just released, as part of its Abingdon Anthem Series, a new edition of "Thine Be the Glory," his festive setting for Choir, Congregation, Brass, Percussion and Organ.

Dan continues in his current residence at Gilmour as religious superior.

Roland Driscoll and the Sisters at the Seton Thrift Shop in Harriman, Tennessee, sent information on an ecumenical Memorial Service held on October 27th at Blessed Sacrament Church, Harriman, for Br. Gonzaga Day. Bishop Anthony J. O'Connell participated in the service. An article in *The East Tennessee Catholic* dated October 26th advertised the occasion and recounted Br. Gonzaga's role in founding the Thrift Store and in helping the missions.

Br. Roland added a note about "the GROWTH of the Church in these parts. We hear about the DECLINE of the Church but it certainly is not true in East Tennessee."

Word was received recently of the re-election of Br. John Gleason as provincial of the Eastern Brothers Province, and of the election of Fr. Stephen Gomes as vice provincial of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Vice Province in Bangladesh, replacing Fr. Benjamin Costa.

Br. Simon Murren of Columba Hall died at St. Joseph Med Center; South Bend, early on the morning of November 30 of heart failure. The funeral was held December 3. Br. Melchior Polowy (SW), a resident of Dujarie House for the past two years, died at St. Joe, on November 12. He was buried in St. Joseph's Cemetery at the Holy Cross Brothers Center. He was an institution in the world of high school wrestling for years at Holy Cross School in New Orleans. Fr. James Buckley (I) died in late November at Holy Cross House. Please remember these three religious in your prayers. Also, please remember Mr. Daniel Annan, older brother of Br. Joseph Annan. Daniel died as the result of a traffic accident near Nsawam, Ghana, on November 3. Br. Joseph is studying for a masters degree at the University of Notre Dame and is living at Columba Hall. Remember too the aunt of Br. Philip Armstrong, Josephine Kirkpatrick, who died at age 88 on November 14, and the brother of Br. Just Paczesny, Alfred "Bud" Paczesny, who died at the age of 77 on November 19. Bud helped conduct the brothers' funerals for several years.

Also remember in your prayers Ellen Wilson, sister of Br. Kenneth Kane, who is seriously ill and whose prognosis is not good, and Dorothea Mallon, mother of Dan Mallon, home till mid-January helping care for her since she broke her hip a few weeks ago.

After many years ministering on the east coast of Florida, **Br. Donald McIntyre** will begin work at Dujarie House, Notre Dame on December 10. He will be residing at Columba Hall.

Because eight Midwest brothers are delegates to the general chapter in Rome in July of 1998, the province will not be sending any Midwest religious to the Le Mans Heritage Session held from June 16-30 in Le Mans.
