On October 5 Br. Joe Barry, Director of Campus Ministry at St. Edward's University in Austin, Texas, began a seven-day bike ride from Austin to Dallas along with 720 other cyclists to raise funds (\$2.8 million) for AIDS research and treatment and to get the word out about AIDS and what it can do to the human body. Br. Joe himself raised nearly twice the required sponsorship amount for each individual rider.

The extremely wet weather in mid- and Eastern Texas at that time interrupted the journey for a day, but did not dampen the spirits of the participants or those cheering them along the way.

As an article in *Hilltop Views*, the campus newspaper (Nov. 6, 1998), said, "Besides doing a great thing for a good cause, participating in this ride served as a healing process for Brother Joe. Three weeks after one of his former students died of AIDS at the age of 25, he received the information on the Texas ride and quicky decided to take part in it. 'I wanted to do this not only for him but for all those people who have AIDS or who have died of AIDS,' said Brother Joe. 'It seemed the most positive thing I could do with my grief.'"

Beginning officially on *February 1, 1999*, the *delivery and visiting address* at the Holy Cross Village at Notre Dame, including province offices and Holy Cross College, will become 54515 State Road 933 North, replacing the former 1801 Michigan St. and U.S. Business 31/33. The beginning of work on redesigning the layout of the main entrance and new signage for it required alignment with the county's numbering system, and the highway had only last year been officially renamed as a state road rather than a national highway (which now bypasses South Bend).

The County Survey Office assigned the first three digits (545), and the last two (15) were chosen to coordinate with WNDU's use of 16 (they are Channel 16 in South Bend). The studios are located directly across from the Village, so we are on the odd-numbered side of the highway.

Br. Joseph Chvala reports from Lakewood that Mr. Charles "Chuck" Step, husband of Beverly Step, close friend and cook/laundress for the brothers at St. Edward the past fifteen years, died recently and the family requests prayers.

Br. Victor Chouinard's (SW), father, Mr. Vic Chouinard, died in Cathedral City, California, on November 14. Br. Victor spent many years at St. Joseph Farm on the staff and was known to many in the province.

Dates to note: For your short-term planning, you are reminded that the jubilee celebrations for 1999 are to be held on Saturday, June 19, 1999, at 2:00 p.m. in Sacred Heart Basilica, Notre Dame.
