July-August 2000

From July 20 to 23 some 400 men and women of Holy Cross gathered at Saint Mary's, Notre Dame, to celebrate together the theme of Jubilee 2000.

Substantive and moving keynote talks were given by Fr. Hugh Cleary, superior general of the men's congregation, Br. Joel Giallanza, an expert in community history and Moreau spirituality, and Sr. Mary Kay Kinberger, M.S.C., superior general of the Marianites.

Through formal discussions responding to the keynote speakers and in informal conversations throughout the weekend, which was inexplicably beautiful throughout, not usually a northern Indiana meteorological trait in July, the participants dealt with the challenges arising from our heritage and from the realities of today's Church and world.

A soiree was held each evening, that of Saturday being an ice cream social hosted by the brothers at Schubert Villa. Developments in health care, residences, the Village, and at Holy Cross College were the topic of many conversations that evening.

Participants departed after a festive liturgy Sunday the 23rd with renewed hope for further communication and collaboration toward closer union among the four congregations.

Ms. Jean Merrill is the new controller for the Midwest Province, replacing Ms. Barbara Powlison, who left as of June 30 for another position in the South Bend area.

Jean, a licensed CPA, is a native of South Bend, but was away from the city for 25 years, first in Michigan, then the last 12 years in Wooster, Ohio. She returned with her daughter, Lindsey, to South Bend this spring, and Jean signed up with a temporary employment organization, planning to spend the summer before looking for something permanent. Providentially, she says, the controller's position for the brothers was the first assignment she received, and she decided to remain with Holy Cross.

Lindsey will begin studies at Holy Cross College this coming semester, where a sister-in-law of Jean, Mary Merrill, is a teacher as well as at Notre Dame. Jean's aunt is Holy Cross Sister Carmel Marie, whom many of the brothers know from ministries in South Bend

Jean acknowledges she is assisted as controller by an excellent staff, all of whom "make a difference and are focused as a unit" on their mission in the business office. The staff consists of Br. Michael Becker, Sherry Bernot, Br. Albert Kern, Donna Niezgodski, Jane Smith, Janet Teller, and regular volunteer Br. James Bluma.

On July 18 Br. Michael Amakyi, West African district superior, and Br. Daniel Dardoe, assistant district superior, left Columba Hall to return to Ghana. They had been staying at Notre Dame since before chapter, and on weekends had been assisting Br. Raymond Papenfuss, mission promoter, in fulfilling mission appeal obligations in parishes in the Midwest area of the United States.

July 2 saw the District of West Africa celebrating the reception of five novices into the Blessed Brother Andre Novitiate at Brafuyaw. Two of the novices are from the

District of East Africa. The newly received group was made up of Brs. Patrick Baah, Michael Effa-Kumi, and Ebenezer Andre Prah of Ghana, Br. David Eliaona of Tanzania, and Br. Ronald Kawooya of Uganda. These five men join the five novices already at Brafuyaw preparing to petition for first profession of vows. Six young men professed their vows on July 1 in Uganda for the District of East Africa. Br. Joseph Tsiquaye is novice director, assisted by Br. Richard Johnson.

Congratulations to the newly received novices, who, together with their East African brothers, represent a new thrust in vocation promotion in Africa, a direction that promises much for the immediate future of both districts in Africa.

Congratulations too to the eleven young men in the United States who completed their canonical novitiate year at Cascade, Colorado, on July 29. Ten of these men will pronounce their vows and all will continue their post-canonical novitiate formation in various programs. **Fr. David Guffey** (I) is novice director, assisted by **Br. Thomas Moser**. Our best wishes and prayers go out to all these men.

Br. Cornelius Corcoran (SW) died at the age of 82 on June 26 at Dujarie House, arriving only weeks before from Austin, Texas, where he had been an extremely effective teacher at St. Edward's University for over 40 years. A memorial mass was celebrated at Dujarie on June 28, and the funeral was held in Austin, Texas, on July 3. Fr. Allen Cormier, C.S.C. (S), died at the age of 81 on July 4 at Holy Cross House, Notre Dame, where he had been residing for some time. He was ordained in 1946. Prior to the funeral and burial in Austin, Texas, a memorial mass was celebrated in Baldwin, Louisiana, where Fr. Cormier was pastor for many years. Prayers are requested for their souls as well as that of Fr. Philippe Payant, C.S.C. (IN), who died at the age of 82 on July 19 at the Anbu Ashram, Palani, India. An Indian citizen and a member of the Province of India, Fr. Payant was born in 1917 and ordained in 1944. He had been in India since the late 1950's and had spent over 25 years at the ashram, where he was its first guru. The funeral was held on July 20 with burial at the ashram. On July 25 in Northeast India, Fr. Victor Crasta, C.S.C. (IN), was ambushed and shot to death for unknown reasons. He was ordained for the Province of India in 1989. His funeral was scheduled for July 27. Fr. Paul Pudussery, C.S.C. (IN), was wounded in the same attack. Please keep both these men in your prayers, as well as the entire province, whose provincial is Fr. Maurice D'Souza, who studied for several years at Notre Dame in the mid-eighties, residing at Moreau Seminary.

In your prayers also remember **Br. Frank Meduri**'s mother, **Mrs. Carmella Meduri**, who died July 24 and was buried in Ravenna, Ohio, July 27 with several brothers in attendance. Likewise, remember **Br. Stephen Carter**'s sister who died recently, and **Br. Robert Fillmore's** mother, who is suffering from the late stages of leukemia, as well as **Br. James Rottenbucher**'s sister, who recently underwent a successful operation and was recuperating at home as of July 12.

Br. Thomas Corcoran reports that in June on the occasion of his 50th anniversary of graduation from Notre Dame he received from **Fr. Edward Malloy, C.S.C.**, president, a papal blessing and a special citation. Br. Thomas also indicated that he continues to

tutor at three different locations during the year: Ivy Tech State College, the Charles Martin Youth Center, and Holy Cross College. And for this summer he was asked again to tutor at the Chapin St. Clinic in South Bend. Br. Thomas regards these opportunities as blessings that help him keep in touch with teaching, and, more importantly, with people who have made a difference in his life.

The May 2000 *News Notes* from the St. Joseph Province in Dhaka reveal that **Br. Ronald Drahozal** received a special award from the Rotary Club for his social work at APON with recovering addicts.

Br. Donald Fleischhacker reports from Holy Cross High School in River Grove that on June 24, Francis Cardinal George, Archbishop of Chicago, celebrated a Millennium Mass in honor of the Body and Blood of Christ at rainy Soldiers Field for a crowd estimated at approximated 30,000. For the occasion the field was renamed, "Field of Faith." Besides Br. Donald, Br. Julian Przybyla attended the function.

They were led by **Mr. Robert Kloska**, campus minister at Holy Cross College. Present at the sendoff were many brothers from the area who had served in Ghana, including Holy Cross president **Br. Richard Gilman**, and **Brs. Michael Amakyi, Daniel Dardoe,** and **Anthony Dadzie**. The students underwent briefings and preparations for several days on campus before a final evening session at Columba Hall on July 18 at which they were given the opportunity to listen to and question brothers who had served in Ghana about their experiences of life there.

Br. Roland Driscoll wrote from Knoxville remarking on the recent deaths of two individuals closely related to Holy Cross. The first was former brother **George Kovatch**, who taught at Cathedral when Br. Roland was principal there. George's wife, Louise, wrote from their home in Lady Lake, Florida, that George had succumbed to the last of a series of heart attacks on June 20. The other death was that of **Joe Dezelan**, long time

coach at Cathedral who retired in 1970 after 26 football seasons with a record of 182-60-8, 13 city titles and a 1952 state championship. A fixture at Cathedral, Joe had continued at the school as athletic director and then in alumni relations and development until his death at the age of 86, capping a loyal and dedicated relationship of some 56 years. **Mrs. Joe Dezelan** survives and lives at 6752 Coatbridge Circle, Indianapolis IN 46254.
