Long a devoted employee of the *Ave Maria Press*, he was widely nown in his later years for his professional photographic work, which he had elevated from the tatus of a hobby. His funeral was held at the Brothers Center on October 27 at 4:00 p.m., with urial following immediately in St. Joseph Cemetery.

Br. Laurian LaForest (EB) died October 20 in a hospital in Albany, New York, at the ge of 89. Br. Laurian had been active up to the time of his hospitalization, most recently as ong-time archivist of the Eastern Province of Brothers at Valatie, NY. Br. Laurian's attention to etail was valued both in his apostolic work in schools and his respectful preservation of community history in the archives. He had been suffering from poor health for some years. He was buried at Valatie on October 24.

Also deceased is John Balog, brother of Br. Vincentius Balog. John died in early october and was buried in Warren, Michigan, on the 14th.

On Friday, September 25, **Br. William Dygert** successfully defended his dissertation at the University of Dayton for a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership. The title of the dissertation is A study of the President/Principal Administrative Model in Catholic Secondary Schools in the United States. Br. William's graduation is scheduled at Dayton for December 19.

Br. William, Superintendent of Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Providence, Rhode sland, also recently attended a Catholic School Superintendents meeting in Orlando, Florida, just efore coming to the province schools meeting for administrators and boards sponsored by the rovincial administration at Notre Dame in early October.
