



#### A Piece of the Puzzle

Dear Associates and Friends,

I like to think that God's design for all of creation is like a puzzle. Each part of creation is like one piece of this puzzle. While necessary in its uniqueness to have a special place in the puzzle, of itself it does not contain the whole design. To use another metaphor St. Paul says that we humans only "see partially." This has real consequences when we consider the whole of creation, the whole Christ, the whole Church. It helps us from making absolute statements and leaves us open to receive new insights and to have new experiences of the God who embraces all.

The painter, George Seurat, captures in his masterpiece "Sunday Afternoon in the Park" the use of contrasting colors side by side. When perceiving the painting up close the colors keep their individual characteristics, but when they are seen from a distance, they seem to blend into one color. So what seems to be contradictory up close becomes something new and beautiful from a distance.


