



As evidenced in Old Testament scriptures, some Jews, influenced by the beliefs of their pagan neighbors, imagined that God was aided in the government of his creation by a council of consultants known as the Sons of God (1].




- {1} "Sons" (meaning connected to or with); not referring to male offspring of a father.
- {2} the satan: (uncaptialized); does not refer to Satan, the devil.


