Reflections on Brother John Tryon, C.S.C.

"Jesus is my friend, my brother, and companion."
One of John's last sentences to one of our seminarians.

The vocation as Brother was a tireless service for him. When he decided to enter Holy Cross, his neighborhood friends did not believe him. He was a bit undisciplined and they did not know of his desire to dedicate his life to something religious. He was different from the rest.



Getting to know Holy Cross awoke his deep desire to dedicate himself to teaching; he wanted to educate souls and hearts, and for this he demonstrated a deep passion in his life.

He studied literature and theology because he wanted to understand the beauty of contemplating God. He loved novels because they helped him dream about infinity.

He loved theology because the great theologians and philosophers had that same concern, getting to know the beauty of God.

His heart had a desire to be a missionary, and he fell in love with Peru; he always said that he wanted to return to Peru soon. He used to say: "I am passionate about Peru. I learn new things every day."

He loved getting to know other countries, other cultures, and he felt that God wanted it to be that way; he was a seeker of the treasures hidden in the people of Peru.

The week before his death, he spent the whole week sharing in a retreat with the Chilean community. When he finished, he said: "Of everything I have received these days, I need more time to think about it. I need more time to meditate and think about this retreat."

Today, in a couple of hours, two young men from the congregation will consecrate their lives to Holy Cross in Mexico and tomorrow they will be ordained as deacons.

There are also many others in religious life who feel great pain at John's departure. His calm, observant, and profound presence marked their lives.

John wanted to reach those who had strayed far away, those who had a hard time finding God's presence; those that John mentions the most and asked the Apostles – Philip: "Lord, we want to know Jesus."

John sought the Lord and, although books introduced him to another world, it was his closeness to people, their faces, their own stories, which invited him to let go, to not be afraid and face questions and doubts.

Today we thank God for having put him in our lives and we are pained for not being able to say goodbye.

We ask him to provide us with that generosity, to give our lives for extraordinary, crazy things. He left suddenly, without warning because he never liked making a show of things.

"If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor."


