Installment - 14 — Do We Have Another Saint? Brother Columba O'Neill, C.S.C. (1848-1923)



In January of 1918, Brother Columba spent twenty-four days in Joliet, Illinois. His days were spent seeing the sick and he "effected about seventy or eighty wonderful cures that we know about." The following four handwritten pages were found among the artifacts of Brother Ernest Ryan, CSC, the author of the lone biography of Brother Columba, These Two Hearts, 1948. They are in his very legible handwriting. You will also read in the newspaper article by Rev. Carl Bruhn, a minister, in the Joliet Evening Herald and reprinted in the South Bend Tribune (Feb.

13, 1918) his "take" on Brother Columba.

Ghana Celebrates Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, Commissions New Missions, and Welcomes First Holy Cross Priest from East Africa

The family of Holy Cross in Ghana gathered to celebrate our Congregational Feast Day and used the occasion to commission four (4) of our Brothers who are ready to take up new ministries in the District of West Africa and also formally welcome into the District Fr. Agapetus from the District of East Africa on mission to Ghana.

Holy Cross in Ghana has responded positively and accepted the invitation from two Arch/Bishops to begin separate ministries in their Dioceses.

The District took advantage of the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, which falls on the 15th of September on the Church's Calendar, to commission our four (4) Holy Cross Brothers about to embark on this mission.

As has been the practice each year, the membership of the District gathers to celebrate our Congregational feast day, but this year was different as it was marked by the District meeting, which because of the pandemic could not meet over the period but by the grace of God were able to gather this time, celebrate the Eucharist, and commission our four Brothers going on missions.

As already stated in the introduction, equally exciting news is the fact the District of West Africa has deepened its collaborative efforts with Holy Cross in East Africa. For the first time in the history of the District of West Africa, we have officially welcomed a Holy Cross priest from the District of East Africa to work in Ghana. He is Fr. Agapetus, who will be working at St. Brother Andre Senior High School as a chaplain and teach religious subjects as well. Fr. Agapetus is young and comes to Ghana with much passion for ministry. We wish him a wonderful stay and experience while in Ghana.

It was indeed a joyous and memorable occasion to have the Brothers of Holy Cross, our Holy Cross Sisters and, since Fr. Bob Gilmour left for the US, we were glad to have a Holy Cross priest in our midst. Find below pictures to spice up your read.

O God, help me put my life into your hands so that my trust in your love takes away paralyzing fear.






