Presenters



Thomas Blantz, CSC, is an emeritus Professor of History from the University of Notre Dame where he taught for over forty years. With an interest in diplomatic and religious American history, he has published biographies of the labor leader Rev. Francis Haas and the educator George Shuster.



Kevin Cawley for over 30 years has been in charge of the Catholic historical collections in the Notre Dame Archives -- the collections that are not university records. In order to document the history of the Catholic Church in the United States, since the middle of the nineteenth century the Notre Dame Archives has collected historical material including Catholic personal papers, institutional records, manuscripts, microfilm, printed material, and digital records. Before becoming an archivist, Cawley spent nine years as a college English teacher at John Carroll University, Cornell University, and Vassar College; he has an M.A. from John Carroll University, a Ph.D. from Cornell University, and an M.S.L.S. in archival administration from Case Western Reserve University.



Frank Ellis, CSC (ND '58 & ND '93) is a retired Holy Cross Brother who resides at Columba Hall on the Notre Dame campus. He was a teacher of math, Latin and history, and an administrator in Holy Cross schools in the USA and abroad for more than 50 years. One hobby of his in retirement is reading, researching, and writing about various facets of Holy Cross and Notre Dame history.



Margaret Hultz and Marie Davis for twenty years have worked together to sleuth out history's little-known stories. As innovators, they craft their discoveries into projects geared to capture the public's interest. Hultz and Davis have created large and small scale history projects including a syndicated cartoon strip, a monumental travelling outdoor art project, *Ten Great State Women*, which was formally celebrated on the State capitol grounds. They also produced *Sphinx of the Bluegrass*, a mystery radio show research hunt in partnership with the Louisville Free Public Library. Recently Hultz and Davis began their most favorite project ever, a series of digital apps featuring the stories of Catholic Sisters' orders, highlighting their service as nurses during the U.S. Civil War.



George Klawitter, CSC, is a retired Professor of English from St. Edward's University, where he taught for eighteen years. He now teaches part-time at Holy Cross College, Notre Dame, and has recently published the book *Early Men of Holy Cross*.



Hugh O'Donnell, father of 5 children, all ND grads with 13 grandchildren. MS Chemical Engineering (University of Pittsburgh 1968), MA Theology (University of Notre Dame 2009), retired Lieutenant-Colonel USAF Reserves C-130 pilot. Research engineer for Gulf Oil (1969-1984), AP chemistry teacher for 20 years in Pittsburgh public schools (1985-2005), and now at Holy Cross College teaching pre-med chemistry.



Anthony J. Oleck graduated from the University of Notre Dame in 2014 with a degree in history and theology with a philosophy minor, and in 2016 from the Master of Theological Studies program. He has served as the Assistant Rector of Fisher Hall and the Full-Time Assistant Rector of Dunne Hall.



Joseph Tobin earned a BFA and a master's degree in art at Notre Dame. He taught high school art courses for 43 years. Now he and his wife Sally live at Holy Cross Village where he has offered art workshops for fellow residents.



Marsha Stevenson has been a librarian at the University of Notre Dame's Hesburgh Library since 1990. Prior to library school she studied history and art history at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. Her research interests focus on Rome and its churches, and in particular on Santa Brigida, which was a Holy Cross property in the mid- to late-nineteenth century.

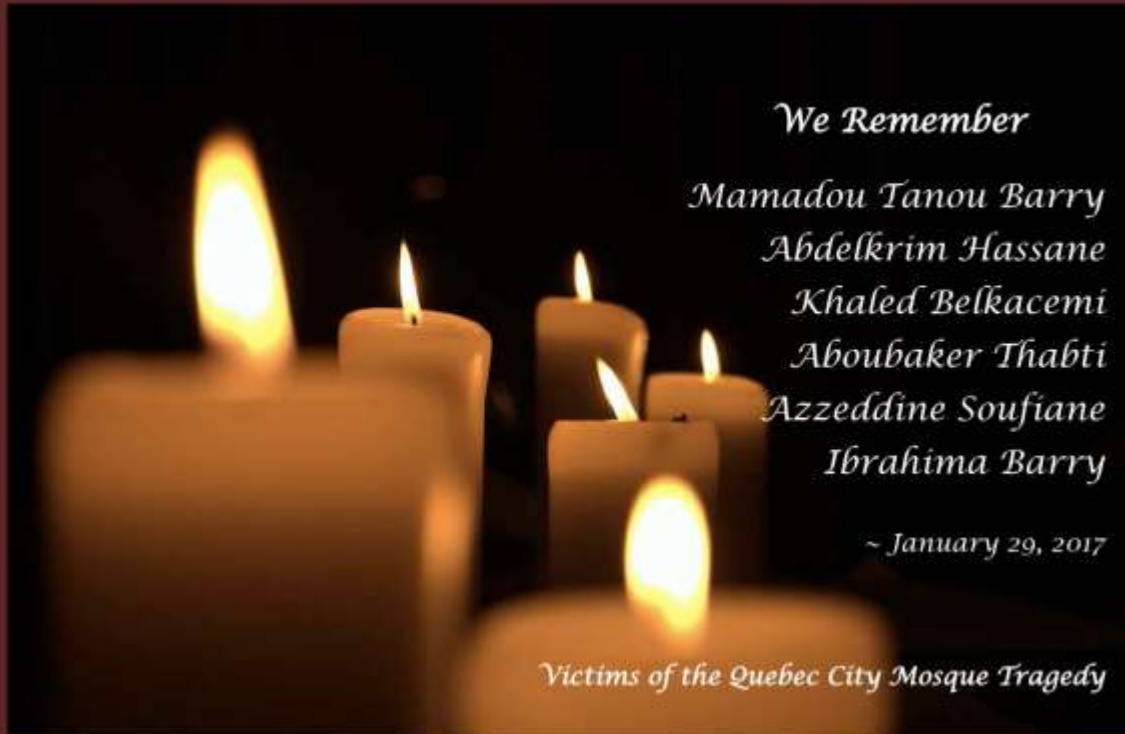
