

January 17, 1913


Fifth letter from Brother Columba to Fathe Giglinger.

- He talks about going to Chicago;
- Also tells about going to St. Mary's College where "lately they had several cures there."
- While at St. Mary's, "10 sisters came to me for cures; went on their knees to me to make the Sign of the Cross on them with the badge. Would not that kill your nerves?"
- "God honor[s] me and humbles [me] at the same time."
- Tells about curing a Notre Dame student. "I made the novena for him and he is a little better; made another one and he can talk now and keep up a conversation."
- "Got 12 cures last week."
- Finally, he says that he cured an "insane priest who now" and "another priest teach can with View Letters consumption."

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
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Holy Cross Roads Writings for the Journey

- Can you say that you have wisdom that comes from reflecting on your experiences?




