

The Renovated Hoban Dome





The Golden Dome serves as the main entrance to Archbishop Hoban High School.


The project is finished. These pictures show the Dome entrance (looking to the north) with new paint work. The stained-glass windows were cleaned and repaired.





These pictures are closeups for two of the restored stained-glass windows under the Hoban Dome.






Columba Hall Elevator Its Ups and Downs

Bible and the "Monster's Bride" (continued from the Book of Tobit in the previous issue of *Midwest-Midweek*) - In creating another character, Sarah, in Tobit, the writer used an ancient Middle East and Eastern European folktale titled "Monster's Bride," of which a brief synopsis follows:

A beautiful young bride on her wedding night is beset by the sudden, mysterious death of her new husband by the machination of a seemingly overly jealous dragon or snake.

Sarah is the beautiful, pious daughter of Raguel. Raguel is related to Tobit, whose son Tobiah is destined to marry Sarah. (By Mosaic Law, Tobiah as the only available relative is obligated to marry the widowed Sarah). Her dilemma is the distressful fact that each of her previous

seven marriages ended with each husband suddenly and mysteriously dying on the wedding night as the result of the evilness of an overly jealous demon. (Tobit's author substituted *demon* for *monster.*)

Nevertheless, Tobiah took Sarah as his wife. Good like his father, Tobiah was spared from the fate of Sarah's former husbands: Through Divine in-Intervention, the Demon was prevented from carrying out his mischief and exiled back to hell.

Everything with everybody turned out well. When Tobit eventually died, he and his wife were buried in the manner of their request by Tobiah.


