One of Three from Ghana – a Timely Gilmour Update

March, 2016 -- It is without question a long way from the coast of Ghana to northeast Ohio! **Brother Augustus Mensah** came to Gilmour Academy as one of three Ghanaian Brothers (including Aristide Biney and Kenneth Goode) to spend the spring semester in the States experiencing the Holy Cross schools here. They have been "taking turns" six weeks at a time residing at Gilmour, Archbishop Hoban High School in Akron, and St. Edward High School in Lakewood.

Augustus was born of Mr. Peter Mensah and Mrs. Juliana Eshun Mensah in the Shama area near Sekondi-Takoradi where, as a boy, he spent many days with the folks along the Shama seacoast. As a young man in this region near Secondi-Takoradi, Augustus Mensah was known more familiarly as "Papa Enimil." Active as an altar boy and serving in

the Mission House in Shama, Augustus Mensah often visited his grandparents and provided services to them when in elementary school.

"I first met the Brothers while studying at the Teacher Training College in 1999," Augustus relates. "Brothers Michael Amakyi and Daniel Dardoe were among the first Brothers I met." It was not until about five years later that Augustus awoke to the idea of becoming a Brother himself, beginning his formation in October of 2004.

While chatting with us in Holy Cross House on the Gilmour campus, Br. Augustus said he earned his bachelor's degree from Christ the Teacher Institute in Nairobi, Kenya. Recently tapped to provide the administrative core for the brand new "St. Brother Andre Bessette High School" near Accra, Augustus and his colleagues have been earnestly preparing themselves for the tasks ahead.

"I have really enjoyed being at Gilmour this month" commented Brother Augustus. "As a school, I found Gilmour to be a welcoming place at every level in ways that go beyond hospitality. The students and adults in this community show a warm openness, honesty, and humility that is truly impressive."

During his visit with us on the Gilmour campus, Augustus noted the many ways Gilmour students provide service to the poor and marginalized, including the food drives at holidays and the school trips to hospitals and food kitchens.

As part of his experience of life in the United States, Augustus joined social studies teacher and department chair Matthew Lindley and his class in Constitutional Law for a tour of Washington DC prior to moving on to visit Hoban.

"This was an amazing, exciting trip! It really captured more of the reality of America for me. We entered the Supreme Court and heard part of a case. We visited the Senate chambers and heard some of the arguments. We saw the White House, the Library of Congress, and many other American sites. I feel so grateful to Matthew Lindley and Gilmour for being able to include me in this experience.

I hope Aristide, Kenneth, and I can return to Ghana to begin creating a new high school that may one day serve the community of Accra like the Holy Cross schools here in Ohio."

We wish you the best, Brother Augustus, as you move on to your new ministry in Ghana.






