indeed, the most important one of our entire lifetime might be the least in our thoughts, and not one of our own design.


Just as Jesus, being human, as we all are,

For the past several years a group of Notre Dame students has been meeting with the residents of Columba Hall, a retirement facility for the Brothers of Holy Cross, located just north of the Grotto. The students have been sharing a meal with the Brothers on a weekly

basis and attending a monthly game night.

Jin Rui Cai '24 organized the group of fellow science majors stating: "Both sides have much to gain, as students can learn a lot from the Brothers, and the Brothers can benefit from more social interaction." Cai states that "in the process of getting to know the Brothers, who have an entire lifetime of stories and a wealth of knowledge to share, I reflected a lot on what I value and how my actions impact others around me."

He further states: "I learned a lot about the history of Holy Cross and the role that the Brothers played in establishing Notre Dame and building it up to what it is today. It's also been interesting to learn about the international adventures that many of the Brothers at Columba Hall participated in when they were younger. 


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






## **Bible Bites** by Brother Robert Mosher, C.S.C.

#### **GAMALIEL**




Gamaliel was the most prominent Pharisee in New Testament times. Repute to be more moderate in religious views than others of his sect, Gamaliel was considered the most distinguished teacher of the Torah. He had been Paul's teacher.

Gamaliel earned his place in the New Testament in Luke's *Acts, Chapter 5.* He successfully persuades the Sanhedren from ordering Peter and the oher Apostles being put to death; He arugues, ". . . have

nothing to do with these men [Apostles], let them go; for if this activity [speaking of Jesus] is of human action, it will destroy itself; but if it comes from God, you will not be able to destroy them, you may even yourselves be fighting against God" (vss 37-39.

Gamaliel's praiseworthy defense earned him a legendary place in the early Christian Church.

#### The Truth about Myself

Given the state of affairs, many are all too happy to criticize us which can leave us feeling unworthy, and even rejected. Being human we will never reach that kind of perfection when we translate Scripture telling us "Be perfect like your heavenly Father is perfect." Who could attain that standard? To appear "perfect" we can put on a persona or wear a mask of always doing the right thing or projecting the blame on others taking the focus off of ourselves. We pride ourselves in "keeping up with appearances."

When there is another way of looking at this passage in the context in which this statement about being perfect is made, it makes more sense. 
