Excerpts from Early Letters By Brothers of Saint Joseph and Holy Cross

Translation from the French by Brother George Klawitter, C.S.C.:

Brother Andre Mottais arrived at Ruille in October 1820 to become a Brother of St. Joseph, little realizing that he would become the most important of the early Brothers of St. Joseph, being named the Primary Director, a position he held for a dozen years. A month and a half after he arrived at Ruille, he wrote to his family back in Larchamp:



"Papa, Mama, Jean, François, Joseph, Jeannette, and Marie, my sister-in-law, I wish all of you a blessed year, perfect health, peace, unity, harmony, calm hearts, joy in God, prosperity in all your affairs, and all that you could desire. I wish you the blessings of heaven, the fruitfulness of earth, and paradise at the end of our days. I wish the same for my godmother and her husband. All that we could possibly desire rests in God. It is heaven, my dear family, that we should desire. All blessings are promised to us, and it is up to us to get them. God so wills it. So let us work at acquiring them for the glory of God."

Andre was 20 years old when he wrote this letter. Only recently has it come to the Congregation of Holy Cross from the Mottais family in France.
