





History in the Making: To God be the Glory!

This article was sent in three months ago but because I, Brother Richard Johnson, was having health issues, it was set aside and did not get into the news. It illustrates the excitement and hopes of the District working toward fruition. Join with the District, especially in your prayers, in the adventure of becoming a province.

The month of December 2019 has been a special month for the District of West Africa. I don't believe it was planned to be that way, but for those of us who believe in Divine Providence, we will want to celebrate it as such. The first Holy Cross Brothers coming to Ghana arrived on December 2, 1957. Another historic event took place as the District marked the sixty-second anniversary of the arrival of the first missionaries in Ghana.

The Provincial Council of the Midwest Province had decided that one of its meetings in 2019 would be held in Ghana. The lot fell on December. The Provincial was the advance party as he planned to do the Provincial visit prior to the arrival of the other members of the team on Christmas Eve. The team arrived at the Kotoka International Airport and was driven to the District Centre and reached here at the beginning of the Christmas Eve Liturgy. They were welcomed at the gathering of the local church community made up of the religious communities in the Area as well as some friends and faithful who are regular participants at our liturgies.

Christmas Day was a special day for the Family of Holy Cross. As such, we celebrated our Christmas Day Liturgy in late morning, followed by Christmas gathering and dinner. The members who came from a far distance returned to their communities.

December 26, 2019, was a day reserved for visiting the Community sites in the Sekondi-Takoradi area. They visited the Moreau Community at Butumagyebu; the Holy Cross Technical Institute and Home of Hope, Anaji, via Takoradi; St. John's School and Community which hosted the group for lunch. Furthermore, the group made a stop to visit the cradle of Holy Cross formation in Ghana, St. Joseph Hall, which was opened September 1,1962. From there, they visited the two different communities of the Holy Cross Sisters before returning to Cape Coast.

December 27, 2019, will go down as a moment of history in the annals of the Midwest Province and the Congregation. After journeying with the District for sixty-two years, the Midwest Provincial Council held its first Council meeting in Ghana. And not only that, the District Council was invited in for a joint Council

meeting. For the District, this was a moment of grace. It marked a time of great affirmation and recognition for the ways the District has been able to carry on the mission of the Congregation and the Province. This was demonstration of our indissoluble brotherhood as members of the Religious Brothers in Holy Cross. We are eternally grateful for the many ways we as a District, have been mentored to stand on our feet and to carry the banner forward into the future for the Greater Glory of God!


