

Information on individual early Brothers of St. Joseph for posting week by week in 2020.

Prospectus: Each week in this space, we will publish a little something about one of the early Brothers. We hope you enjoy reading about them this year, the 200<sup>th</sup> year of their being founded in France.

**February 2-8** In this week Brother Andre Mottais, the primary director of the Brothers, founded a school in Ruille, France, in 1821, one year after the Brothers of St. Joseph were started. The school was run by the Brothers for 49 years.

February 9-15 In this week we commemorate Brother Vincent Pieau who was born in 1797 (February 15). He was the 18<sup>th</sup> young man to join the Brothers of St. Joseph and came to Indiana with the first group of missionary Brothers in 1841. He died much revered at Notre Dame in 1890 and is buried in the cemetery here on St. Mary's Road
