A Steinway School Gilmour Academy

The selection Dan plays here (actually playing for real, of course) is *Chopin: Valse, Op. 54, No. 2 in C-Sharp Minor*. Be aware that his performance ends just over four minutes in, and there are some minutes of "blank" recording afterward.

This piano, a Steinway "Spirio," is actually a "player" piano, even though you wouldn't know this by its appearance.

"You pick up your I-pad, open the software, pick a piece (from any of several categories) and it 'runs' the piano as if a 'live' player were at the keyboard."

Because of the generosity of **Matthew Figgie, class of '84** at Gilmour (and the Figgie Foundation) Gilmour is becoming a "Steinway school."

We have five Steinway pianos so far, and, over the next couple of years, are due to receive five more.

Most of the folks eating birthday cake last Friday at the Sarasota Friendship Center were miles away from here. Forty-five years ago, in 1973, Anne Feltner is pretty sure she was working for the Bendix Corp. in Southfield, Michigan. Warren Williamson was an instructor at the Federal Aviation Administration institute in Oklahoma City. Vera Clarke, who came to Sarasota seven years ago to live near her son, said she was in Wyoming at the time. This makes them typical of so many elders who find themselves in Southwest Florida after years and careers spent elsewhere, and wind up building a new community through people they meet at the Senior Friendship Center. But Mike Kanozsay, a Hungarian-born dance instructor who came to Sarasota on a Trailways bus in 1957, maintained that he's been a regular at the center from the very beginning — when he would bring students over from his Palm

Avenue studio. “One day, we found out there was music here, and we’d dance,” he said. He still visits in the afternoons, he said Friday, “to hit on the women.”

When Brother William Geenan and Molleen Pust opened up Sarasota’s first gathering place for seniors in 1973, they might not have envisioned six locations in five counties, or a medical clinic that logged some 17,000 visits last year. The centers also coordinate everything for elders from free meals to home health care, offer adult day care for clients with dementia, and provide a full array of classes — from Tai Chi to conversational French to how to use an iPad.

But Friendship Centers CEO Erin McLeod told the celebrants at Friday’s birthday party for the organization, they did anticipate that the need would grow. As proof, she held up a photo of the downtown bungalow where it all started, with a modest sign out front that read “Senior Friendship Centers.” “Brother Geenan knew there would be more,” McLeod said. And it all started, she noted, “with a card table and a black lab and a station wagon.”

Bob Carter, who began working with Geenan and Pust in 1987 and served as CEO until retiring in 2015, told the origin story of Geenan visiting from Indiana in the 1970s, and launching the first center with \$79 in ready funds. “He ran into a couple of people down here,” Carter said. “They had lost their spouses; they were lonely, and engaged him in long conversations.” The opening 45 years ago was far from grand, he added.

But the spirit of it was similar to the informal socializing you see at the centers today — and the demand for a place like this one was evident from the start. “They asked people to come for coffee and doughnuts,” Carter said. “I think they had to go out for doughnuts three times, because they had been expecting a handful and more than a hundred showed up.”



Celebrating Rosh Hashanah


