Fr. John Keefe, CSC, is from Cleveland, Ohio, educated in Catholic schools and graduating from Notre Dame, 1955, while studying Theology in Washington, D.C. He was ordained a Catholic priest in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart, Notre Dame, 1959. The next twenty years (1959-1979) were in Uganda, East Africa, as a bush-missionary during that nation’s turmoil toward and after independence including the terrible Idi Amin years. He then lived at the House of Prayer (Holy Cross Sisters, St. Mary’s, Notre Dame, IN) as chaplain while conducting retreats at Fatima Retreat Center, Notre Dame, IN) and Bangladesh (1980-1984). From 1984-2014 he served in the many-faceted Holy Cross efforts in Hispanic ministry in California, Texas, Arizona, Oregon, and briefly in Alaska. From 1987-1996 he helped Holy Cross found its ministry in Guadalupe, Nuevo León, Mexico. Since 2015 he’s been blessed to have extraordinary help in dealing with health issues while learning to pray to a better-known God in new ways.

Fr. Thomas C Bertone, C.S.C., is assistant religious superior at Moreau Seminary. He holds a B.S. in biology from Stonehill College in North Easton, Massachusetts. After working in Holy Cross Brothers' high schools in the D.C. area, he attended Catholic University where he received his Master's in Social Work in 1997. Tom served the Congregation as the director of Health Care and Aging. He has also received training as a spiritual director.

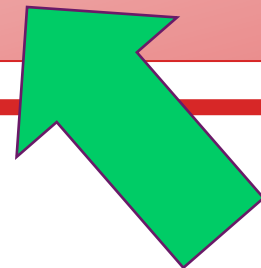
