Brother Camillus (William) Kirsch, C.S.C. December 26, 1916 – February 11, 2016

Brother Camillus (William) Kirsch, C.S.C., age 99, died on February 11, 2016 at Dujarie House in Holy Cross Village at Notre Dame, Indiana. He was born in Indianapolis, Indiana, the son of Louis and Anna (Schneider) Kirsch. He attended Holy Angels and St. Joan of Arc Elementary Schools and Cathedral High School, graduating in 1934. The Brothers must have influenced him, since he entered the juniorate program at Watertown, Wisconsin, in September, 1934. He went to St. Joseph's Novitiate in Rolling Prairie, Indiana, in August, and pronounced his first vows as a Brother of Holy Cross in August 1936. He then began college studies at the University of Notre Dame and earned his bachelor's degree in June, 1940, graduating *magna cum laude*. After teaching a year at Reitz Memorial High School in Evansville, he was selected to begin graduate studies at Notre Dame and then he went (along with Brother Lawrence Miller) to study at the University of Chicago becoming the first Brothers to earn master's degrees in Social Work in June, 1943.



Brother Camillus was assigned to Father Gibault School for Boys in Terre Haute, Indiana, where he served a total of 27 years on three different occasions as field director and teacher. He was the assistant director of Boysville of Michigan in Clinton for a year. He returned to serve again at Gibault but was needed to teach at his alma mater, Cathedral High, for a year in 1959. At Gibault he served as the houseparent for the younger boys, ages 9 to 12, and made a lasting impression on them. He maintained contact with his boys for many years after they left. A large box of correspondence and photos from his Gibault boys was found in his room, indicative of the lasting impressions and friendships he had in their lives. In 1996, a special award was presented to Brother Camillus that read: *“The excellence that exists at Gibault is a direct result of the high level of professionalism and*

commitment that was established by Brother Camillus and his colleagues since 1934.” In 1971 after the death of his mother, Brother moved into the family home in Indianapolis and was a psychiatric social worker at the Central State Hospital in Indianapolis for 13 years. In 1988 he served as assistant chaplain at the Americana Nursing Home in Indianapolis for 9 years.

In 2000 Camillus moved to Notre Dame to join the community at Columba Hall and in 2006 he moved to Schubert Villa at Holy Cross Village. Camillus had both knees and one hip replaced and would take very brisk walks around the grounds often before residents were awake. He was the ideal model of aging gracefully. His phenomenal memory for names and faces always amazed his students, the patients he treated, and co-workers at hospitals – for he truly was an admirable and dedicated exemplar for those he served. He was loved by his extended family and relatives who often visited and corresponded. His room at Dujarie House contained numerous albums and framed family pictures for he was well-loved by both his own and his Holy Cross family.

Visitation will be held on Wednesday, February 17, 2016, at Our Lady of Holy Cross Chapel within Schubert Villa/Dujarie House from 9:30 to 11:00 AM on the grounds of Holy Cross Village at Notre Dame. The Mass of Resurrection will follow with interment afterward in St. Joseph’s Cemetery of the Village. Kaniewski Funeral Home is handling the arrangements.

Participation in Training Conference: A few staff and the Director participated in training conference both in Dhaka and Malaysia and Bangkok. One such meaningful training was “Training of Treatment Practitioners from Bangladesh, India and Pakistan on Child Drug Addiction Treatment”. This is a new training and fills a bit of the gap in assistance that is to be used for children. We were surprised and encouraged to find out that the expert participants from India and Bangladesh who visited our facilities recognize the type of Children's Program that APON has is unique for both countries.

Outreach Drop In Centres: APON has two ODIC (Outreach Drop In Centres) near the Mirpur Mazar and the staff goes to various spots from Tongi/airport railway stations to Shadarghat/Wise Ghat in old Dhaka and Kamlapur railway station to Mohammadpur area to help youngsters in need of services like awareness of drugs, dealing with a drug using problems, health, hygiene, basic education, some skill training and a lot of loving care and attention, etc.

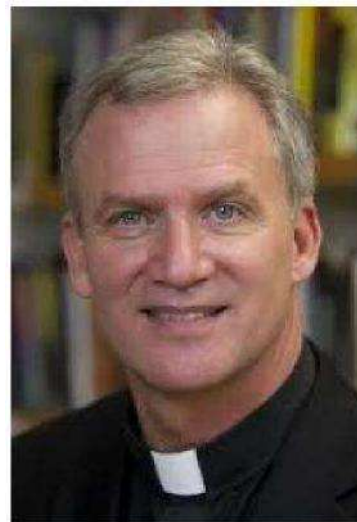
