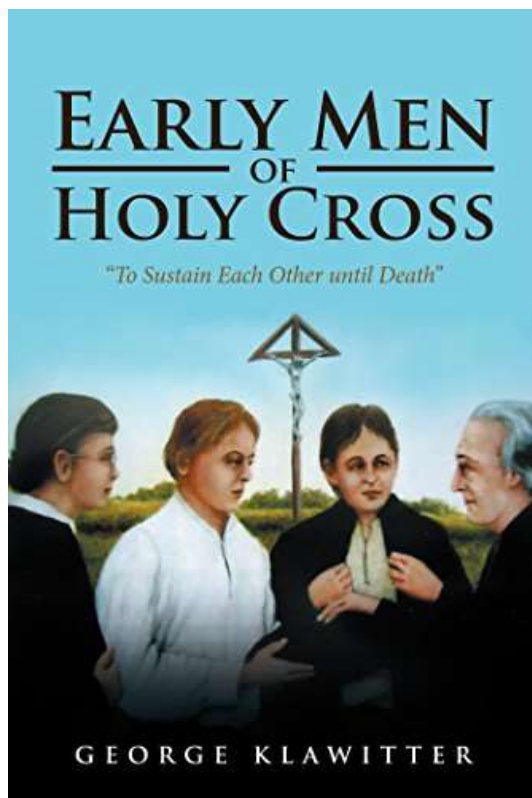

For example, there would be no Holy Cross today if it were not for André Mottais, the first Brother to persevere in Jacques Dujarié’s group of religious men in post-Revolutionary France.”



“Their energies, of course, extended beyond France. Brother Vincent Pieau led two young novice-teachers to America where they lived first near Vincennes, Indiana, and later at Notre Dame du Lac to the north. Brother Hilarion Ferton brought the Brothers back into Africa where they worked tirelessly in conditions that ranged from tolerable to desperate. Everywhere in their correspondence back to France is evidence of their youthful enthusiasm and their commitment to the religious ideals of their founders.”

News from Kathleen C. Kenny Head of School, Gilmour Academy

Beginning in 2017, Gilmour Academy's Lower School will be home to Northeast Ohio's very first French education immersion program. Gilmour was chosen by the French-American Chamber of Commerce and Saint-Gobain, the world's largest building materials company, which has a large operation in the Cleveland area, to formulate a global partnership. Our students will have the incredibly unique opportunity to attend classes with children their age from across the globe. Many schools are looking for ways to send their students out into the world, and this is another way we bring the world to ours. This partnership will add to the energy and vibrancy of our Lower School while simultaneously increasing awareness of our programming in the local community and beyond.

The French-American Chamber of Commerce sought out Gilmour based on our academic rigor, our global outlook, international student programming in grades 7-12, and the Congregation of Holy Cross' French roots. This newfound partnership dwells upon our Holy Cross mission to "cross borders of every sort." Our admission team will review the international ex-patriate students to ensure a good academic fit. In order to integrate the French students effectively into our curriculum, they will spend half the day in our grade-level classrooms at the Lower School and the other half of the day in courses taught strictly in French by native French-certified teachers focusing on curriculum taught abroad. We will be adding the option of French language instruction for all students, and we are actively exploring new integrated opportunities for all.

In addition to our partnership with Saint-Gobain, we will be working closely with other companies with an international reach in our area to join our new and exciting program. We are positioning Gilmour's Lower School to be one of the area's leaders in global education—the potential of this partnership is limitless.
