Holy Cross President-Elect Describes His Vision

Paige hopes to grow enrollment at college.

SOUTH BEND — When **Brother John R. Paige** arrives here next January as president of Holy Cross College, he'll have come full circle.

As a University of Notre Dame undergraduate and a scholastic (a religious brother in training), Paige lived from 1966 to 1968 in a dormitory on what was then the new Holy Cross Junior College campus.

The campus was under construction, with the chapel not yet complete. As a fledgling two-year college, Holy Cross had fewer than 100 students in its founding year of 1966-67.

There were 14 entrants in the recent Apple Dessert Contest at Holy Cross Village. All residents and employees were encouraged to enter a dessert which was judged by



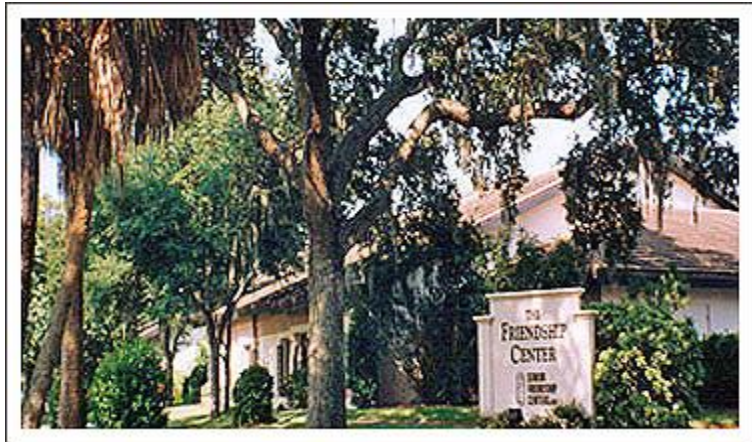
