Holy Trinity Celebrates 100 Years at Guardians of Hope Dinner



On Friday, March 12, Holy Trinity High School celebrated their Centenary in grand style at the 17th Annual Guardians of Hope Dinner at the Marriott Hotel on Chicago's Magnificent Mile. The dinner has evolved over the past 17 years to a point where it now nets over a half million dollars for the school.

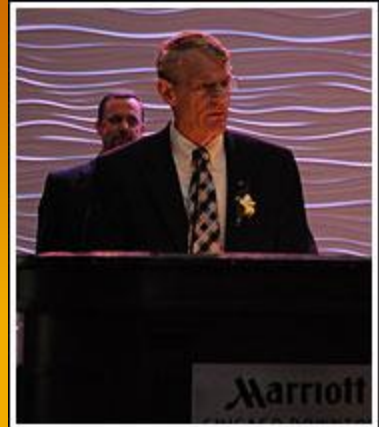
The scholarship auction earned \$135,000 with the help of a \$50,000 challenge. At the end of the dinner former board chairmen Craig Dean and John R. Raitt announced the establishment of \$7.5 million dollar Centenary Capital Campaign to assure the continuation of Holy Trinity High School in the future. So far close to 4 million dollars has been raised even before the formal announcement of the campaign.

Brothers Philip Smith and John Kuhn were part of the video presentation of the school's past 100 years.

Brothers Ken Haders and Philip Smith accepted an award honoring the brothers for their efforts. Brother Chester Freel gave the invocation to the dinner. The efforts of the brothers were mentioned numerous times during the program.

Holy Cross College Hosts Conference for Care Givers

Holy Cross College and Holy Cross Village hosted the Third Annual Gerontology Consortium Conference for Professionals, Caregivers and their Families on Friday, March 12. The keynote speaker was **Martha Branson-Banks**, BS, a retired occupational therapist and educator, artist and speaker on humor and aging; her address was entitled *Aging - Tears or Cheers?*

The conference gave the opportunity to earn continuing education credit for nurses, social workers and nursing home administrators.



There were also four breakout sessions which covered: Hope and Spirituality of Aging, Telling the Stories of Life through Guided Autobiography, Keeping Your Tail Off the Floor (Safety Issues), H.E.L.P. – Healing, Energy, Laughter, Perspective, Tips for a Stronger, Healthier You, Joining Their Journey (Alzheimer's and Dementia), Medications and the Elderly: The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly, VA Benefits: What You Should Know, Mental Health and Aging, A RN Speaks, Nursing and SW Joint Assessment, and a panel discussion: Diversity on Aging.



Pat Adams was the coordinator of the event for the college. The staff of Holy Cross Village helped facilitate the conference. There are six founding member institutions and 42 affiliate institutions in the Gerontology Consortium of Michiana. Holy Cross College and Holy Cross Village are two of the six founding institutions.



News from Guerin Prep High School

Terry Malik, president of Guerin Prep in River Grove, Illinois, and a 1969 Holy Cross graduate, sent along this news release and letter from Cardinal George of Chicago explaining the purchase by the Archdiocese of Chicago of four acres of land currently a part of Guerin Prep. The 4 acres to be sold includes: 80th. Avenue on the east, O'Connor Drive on the south, the HC-MT driveway on the north; the western property line runs down the main hall of the HC building parallel to the trophy cases.

Guerin Prep will retain the other 10 acres of the old Holy Cross campus for use of athletic fields. Guerin Prep will retain the cafeteria and gym of the old building. These facilities will be renamed **Holy Cross Athletic Center at Guerin Prep**. A group headed by Holy Cross graduates Sam Palumbo, Bill Auriema and Dr. Vince Bufalino will help with renovation plans and funding.

The sale of the land to the archdiocese has allowed Guerin Prep to retire their debt plus have \$1 million in their capital account.

Saint Joseph's Hill Secondary School

The most recent building project of **Brother Bernard Klim** in Uganda is Saint Joseph's Hill Secondary School, Kyarusozi Parish, Fort Portal, Uganda, where Brother Bernard lives with the parish community. The pictures are from 2009. Bernard is serving in the District of East Africa which is under the Indiana Province of priests and which was founded a year after the Midwest Province set roots in Ghana, West Africa.



After serving for 30 plus years in Rome at the former Holy Cross International School, Brother Bernard took his self-taught skills in maintenance and art to Uganda, East Africa. In Uganda he has been responsible for the construction of a large church in Kyarusozi and the home of the bishop. Brother also did work on the Andre House pre-novitiate formation center in Jinja, Uganda, and supervised the district headquarters construction in Kampala, Uganda.

Brother Bernard is also well known for his religious artwork in iron which adorns many of the community houses.

Crossing the Divide: Theological Reflections on Migration

In light of contemporary challenges, this talk will explore theological reflection in an age of migration. It focuses on four foundations of a theology of migration and refugees: (1) Imago Dei: Crossing the Problem-Person Divide, (2) Verbum Dei: Crossing the Divine-Human Divide, (3) Missio Dei: Crossing the Human-Human Divide, and (4) Visio Dei: Crossing the Country-Kingdom divide. As a call to cross borders and overcome barriers, migration is a way of thinking about God and human life and an expression of the Christian mission of reconciliation.

Fr. Groody is a Catholic priest, a Holy Cross religious, a scholar, teacher, and an award winning author and film producer. He is currently an [Assistant Professor of Theology](#) and the Director of the [Center for Latino Spirituality and Culture](#) at the [Institute for Latino Studies](#) at the University of Notre Dame. He spent many years working in Latin America, particularly along the U.S.- Mexican Border, and is the author of various [books](#) and [articles](#)
