


## Miracle Worker in the School Kitchen

Chef Paul Boundas creates healthy meals from scratch for less than \$3 per lunch — and the kids even like the food.



On a recent winter day at a Chicago public high school, "fish tacos" were on the lunch menu.

"Look at this," one student grumbled, flicking at a stiff flour tortilla on her tray. "They give us this with fish sticks and call it a fish taco. That ain't lunch."

Not long after, Holy Trinity High School in [Wicker Park](#) was also serving fish. The white fillets came in a crunchy panko-cornmeal crust or baked in olive oil, lemon and herbs, with collard-flecked teriyaki brown rice, olive oil roasted potatoes, steamed broccoli and freshly squeezed lemonade. And the students ate it up.


The meals may sound like they came from two different worlds, but both were served to low-income Chicago high school students as part of the National School Lunch Program.

It's become accepted wisdom among many school officials that the level of federal reimbursement for meals served through the program — \$2.74 per lunch — is too low to cover tasty, nutritious food made from scratch.

But Chef Paul Boundas says he serves his scratch-cooked meals to about 4,500 private school students — including about 300 at Holy Trinity — every day for even less than that modest amount.





## Brother Charles Joseph Krupp, C.S.C. *December 19, 1923 - March 16, 2011*

Br. Charles Joseph Krupp, C.S.C., age 87, died on March 16, 2011 at Dujarie House, Notre Dame, Indiana after a lengthy illness. He was an enthusiastic and talented leader within the Midwest Province of the Holy Cross Brothers, and its Provincial from 1968 to 1979.

Br. Charles was born in New Lothrop, Michigan to Charles, Sr. and Julia (Sharer) Krupp. He attended St. Michael's Elementary and High School in New Lothrop, graduating in 1941. He worked on the family farm for 10 years before he joined the Brothers of Holy Cross and entered St. Joseph's



Novitiate in 1950.

He pronounced his first vows as a Brother on February 2, 1951 and wanted to work at St. Joseph's Farm, but was assigned to study at the University of Notre Dame. He did quite well and graduated with *cum laude* honors in 1954.

Br. Charles' first assignment was to teach for 6 years on the faculty at St. Edward High School in Lakewood, Ohio. He was also the Vocation Recruiter and brought many St. Ed's graduates into the community. He spent a year as Assistant to the Novice Master at St. Joseph's Novitiate and then returned to St. Edward High to be the Principal and Superior for 6 years, until 1967. He was the Province Personnel Director for a year and then was appointed and elected the Provincial of the Midwest Province for a total of 11 years,

In 1980, Br Charles moved to Chicago and was the Director of Development at Holy Trinity High School for 6 years and worked in parish ministry for 2 years. He became Headmaster and President of Le Mans Academy in Rolling Prairie, Indiana from 1991 to 1995. That year he moved south to become the Director of Planning and Development at the Senior Friendship Center in Sarasota, Florida for the next 14 years until 2009. Because of health concerns, he came back north to live at Schubert Villa and Dujarie House at Notre Dame until his death.

Among Br. Charles' many talents was being a concerned listener. He really loved people whether they were his students, their parents, other adults and especially the senior citizens he served. At St. Edward High, he raised the standards of excellence by recruiting top quality students to attend the School and sought scholarships for them. During his tenure as Principal, there were 21 National Merit Scholars among the graduates. He was a very generous man, humorous as well as being perceptive and neat. He personified friendliness and showed real interest in people he met.

Br. Charles was the Midwest Province Provincial at the time of the Vatican II Council. Pope John XXIII said that one aim of the Council was to bring 'fresh air' into the Church. Br. Charles also did that in his tenure as Provincial. One admirable quality he illustrated was valuing the individual differences among the Brothers in his Province. He encouraged Brothers to utilize their talents in pursuing ministries they were interested in, rather than appointing them to positions. Br. Charles was a very spiritual man, generous and well loved by those he cared for.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday, March 22nd, at Our Lady of Holy Cross Chapel from 9:00 to 11:00am on the grounds of Holy Cross Village at Notre Dame. The Mass of Resurrection will then begin at 11:00am with interment afterward in St. Joseph's Cemetery of the Village. Kaniewski Funeral Home is handling the arrangements.
