Province Hosts Congregation Restructuring Committee

On Sunday, July 23, the Midwest Province hosted the Congregation Restructuring Planning Committee meeting at Notre Dame this past week. The committee is made up of community representatives from



throughout the world. The event at Holy Cross Village included a Mass celebrated by Rev. Richard Warner, C.S.C., Superior General at St. Joseph Chapel, followed by a grazing reception at Andre Place in Holy Cross Village.

Earlier in the week the Congregational Finance Task Force met for two days at Notre Dame and attended a Mass, reception and dinner with the Brothers at Columba Hall. The restructuring of the Congregation is the work of two committees: Finance Task Force and Restructuring Planning Committee. The committees will meet when necessary prior to the next General Chapter.



In his homily Father Warner outlined the status of the Brothers in the Congregation of Holy Cross. In the near future vocation gains will be made in Bangladesh, India, Africa and South America. The vocation prospects in the United States, Canada and France look poor. Father General noted the concern of the Restructuring Committees over the decline in the total number of Brothers in the Congregation. He noted that the United States Province of Priests and Brothers are beginning to grow after being stagnant for a while. Father Warner stressed the nature of the Congregation as a ministry by both Priests and Brothers.

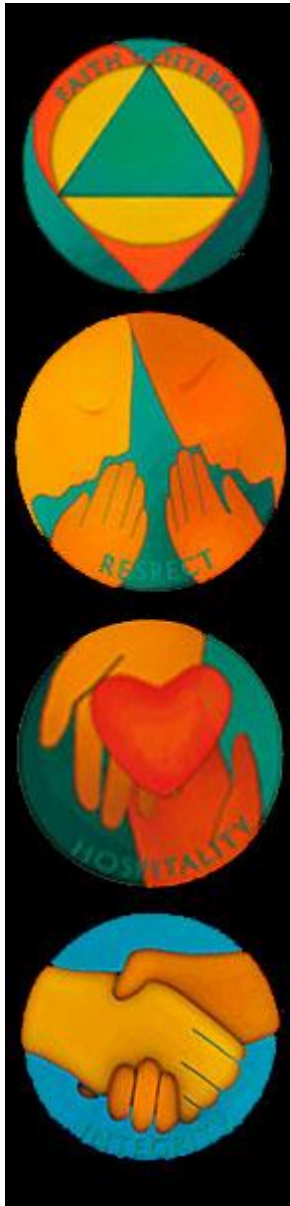
Brothers July Newsletter to Cathedral Alumni
