Farewell



Benedict XVI who is now Pope Emeritus of the Catholic Church, served as the 265th pope from 2005 until his abdication on February 28, 2013.

Lenten Observances at St. Edward High School

St. Edward High School began their commemoration of the Season of Lent with an all-school Mass on Ash Wednesday. During Mass, Fr. Mike McCandless [a graduate of Archbishop Hoban High School] reminded the students that "you get out of Lent, what you put into Lent." He reminded them of the importance of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. He also told them that fasting can also



mean removing things that might get in the way; and, that almsgiving could also mean giving of our time. During this Season of Lent, the St. Edward High School Community is participating in a number of these types of activities:

Lenten Theme: The school has selected a phrase from the Holy Cross Constitutions to be our guiding theme throughout the season of Lent: “If we, like Him encounter and accept suffering in our discipleship, we will move without awkwardness among others who suffer. We must be [people] with hope to bring....It remains only for us to find how even the cross can be borne as a gift.” (Constitution 8:118)

Lenten Lunches – Every Wednesday in Lent, right after school, a group of students gets together to make lunches to be donated to St. Malachi Parish, a church in the City of Cleveland with a significant outreach and ministry to the homeless population of Cleveland.

Weekly Mass – Every Friday morning before school, Fr. Maurice D’Souza, C.S.C., celebrates Mass for the community in the school’s Holy Family Chapel.

Stations of the Cross – On Wednesday afternoons during Lent, a group of students, teachers, parents, and alumni gather to pray the Stations of the Cross. Using the text *You Have Redeemed the World: Praying the Stations in the Holy Cross Tradition*, edited by Fr. Andrew Gawrych, C.S.C., and Fr. Kevin Grove, C.S.C., the group prays the stations in light of their own Holy Cross Heritage, and join with all in the Congregation of Holy Cross who proclaim “Ave Crux, Spes Unica” – “Hail the Cross, our Only Hope.”

Reconciliation Services – On Thursday, March 7 and Wednesday, March 8, the entire school will participate in Reconciliation Services, as a number of priests from the Diocese of Cleveland will join us to hear confessions throughout the two days.

Holy Week Service – On Wednesday, March 27, the last day of classes before students begin their Easter break, the student body will participate in a Holy Week Prayer Service. Planned and coordinated by the students on the St. Edward High School Worship Committee. The service will feature musical, video, and spoken word reflections on the Seven Sorrows of Mary.

Tenebrae – On Wednesday evening, March 27, the St. Edward High School Fathers Club will sponsor a Holy Week “Tenebrae-Styled” Prayer Service

featuring readings from the Passion of St. Mark, the writings of Blessed Fr. Basil Moreau, C.S.C., and the Holy Cross Constitutions, as well as music performed by St. Edward High School students. This service will provide a prayerful way for the school community to prepare for the Easter Triduum.

20th Guardians of Hope Dinner Raises a Half Million Dollars for Holy Trinity

Friday, March 1 Holy Trinity High School held their 20th Annual Guardians of Hope Dinner at the United Club at Soldier Field, Chicago, Illinois. The 540 in attendance raised an estimated half-million dollars for the school, which is in its 103rd year of operation. The past 7 years Holy Trinity have had a 100% college acceptance record. The fundraiser raised a record \$144,000 in their annual scholarship auction at the dinner. The scholarship auction was helped by an anonymous \$50,000 matching gift.

The 10 Holy Cross Brothers in attendance at the affair included **Brothers Chester Freel, Roy Smith, Joseph Fox, Charles McBride, Raymond Harrington, Kenneth Haders, Robert Livernois, Roberto Jimenez, Clement Burger and Binoy Gomes.**

The welcome was by campus minister Fr. Tom Walsh and 2008 Holy Trinity graduate Christina Logan. Holy Trinity President Timothy M. Bopp ran the auction. The student speech was by Maria Asiimwe, Class of 2014.

Mr. Jeff Blackburn, a University of Notre Dame Graduate and Founder and Chairman of Assurance Insurance Agency was the recipient of the 2013 Spes Unica Award, given to the person whose dedication to education represents the hope of tomorrow to the students of today, persons who have brought hope to humankind through their own work and their own lives. Jeff has been active in promoting the Holy Trinity mission the past 10 years. In 2003 he established the Kathleen Christman Scholars Program in honor of his grandmother. To date 5 Holy Trinity students have received full scholarships. Mr. Blackburn was also a critical leader in the effort to reestablish the music program at Holy Trinity.


Dominic Vachon, Ph.D.

Congregational Day of Fasting, Prayer and Almsgiving

As previously announced, the three provinces in the United States agreed on Friday, March 15 as the Congregational Day of Fasting, Prayer and Almsgiving.

You will find a document sharing suggestions from **Fr. Peter Rocca** about how to integrate the intent of this Day of Fasting into the Liturgy of the Hours. You will also find prayer services prepared by **Brs. Richard Critz** and **William Mewes**. I want to thank Richard and Bill on behalf of the province for their efforts.

This year, the Congregation is focusing attention on the **Abhayadhama Human Development Center**, which provides education and a safe home for street boys outside of **Bangalore, India**. The resources provide a history and photos of this ministry of the (Brothers) Vicariate of India.

It is recommended that we have common morning & evening prayer for the day. There are two suggested manners. First, the usual prayer for the day can be used with the following adaptations:

Before Morning Prayer begins, the leader reminds the community that today will be observed as a Congregational Day of Fasting and that all monies collected will go toward assisting Holy Cross religious ministering to the street children in Bangalore, India. The hymns chosen for Lauds and Vespers might reflect the theme of social concern (e.g., The Harvest of Justice [Gather, #513] or God, Who Stretched the Spangled Heavens [Worship, #648]. In place of the concluding prayer at Lauds, the prayer “For the Congregation of Holy Cross,” taken from the Directory of Devotional Prayer, #50, could be used; at Vespers, the concluding prayer, “For the Poor and the Oppressed” (Directory of Devotional Prayer, #80), would be appropriate. These prayers could be said either by the leader alone or by all together.

Individuals and local communities wishing to contribute to the support of the Human Development Center through this Day of Fasting, and other sources, should send their **donations to the Midwest Province Finance Office, by March 31**. Thank you for your kind collaboration in this Congregational effort.

Dear Brothers and Friends,

As we begin to move past midwinter, a number of Province members are experiencing health changes. So that you will be able to keep abreast of developments and keep these brothers in prayer by name, a summary is in order...

Br. Robert Brown began this week to receive both radiation and chemotherapy to achieve remission of a recently-found cancer. Robert is positive and confident about his treatment outcome.

Br. Joseph Dunne continues as a resident of Barnwell Nursing Care Center, in Valatie. He enjoys visits from brothers who live at St. Joseph Center.

Br. Richard Kelly is residing at CORE, a rehabilitation program for those with traumatic brain injuries, located in Dripping Springs, TX, 13 miles west of Austin. He continues to respond well in every way to the program, and has an additional 12 weeks remaining. As his schedule is quite regimented, evening is about the only time he can be visited.

Br Francis Kjeldgaard has returned to Br. Vincent Pieau Center after a fall and repair of a broken hip, and is carefully using his walker, gaining strength each day.

Br. Ralph Kuder is also back at Vincent Pieau after several falls and a time in rehab; he is using his motorized wheelchair to get around. Both Ralph and Francis are very glad to be home!

Br. Richard O'Brien still lives at Barnwell Nursing Care Center, in Valatie. Richard sometimes exhibits a mild disorientation, but, like Joe Dunne, enjoys the visits from brothers.

Br. Edwin Reggio is seriously ill with symptoms of rare, late-stage neurological disorders, and should be cleared for admission to Dujarie House shortly. Edwin has battled these illnesses successfully for many years, but is losing strength at this point. He is now in need of permanent skilled-care-level support, and thankfully there is a bed available. Bill Nick has done a great job attending to Edwin's needs during this period of rapid decline.

Br. John Terlisner has been moved from West Oaks Rehabilitation and Nursing Care Center to St. David's Hospital, South. His physical therapy was recently increased to prepare him to return to Vincent Pieau, but his doctor again suspects fluid on the brain. John has already had four neurosurgeries to relieve pressure in his cranium.

Please pray for these Brothers as they meet their significant health challenges.
