Columba Hall Paving to Begin This Week



This Wednesday and Thursday, barring any unforeseen rain delays, paving will begin on the front drive of Columba Hall. This past week Ziolowski Construction were able to lay most of the new concrete walk which will run parallel to the new road being constructed. The Notre Dame football weekend and Labor Day put a four-day delay on the project. Ritchard Brothers Excavations still has some finish work to do before paving can begin.



Columba Hall will now have the finest skateboard run on campus if the students find it. Workmen at the site see the day railings may have to be installed along the sidewalk to assist the elderly Brother residents of Columba Hall to be able to walk up the steep, long grade. Phil Panzica of Panzica Construction knows the grass slope down to St. Mary's Road is too steep to walk up or down, but should be able to be cut by a lawnmower.

The new front entrance is being fabricated locally and will be the last area to be renovated. The construction is expected to be completed in October.

St. Edward High School Unveils Theme for New School Year at Opening Liturgy

The students, faculty, staff, and administration of St. Edward High School gathered together on the first Friday of this school year to celebrate the opening school liturgy. The Mass, celebrated by class of 1997 St. Edward graduate, Fr. Chuck Butkowski, served to open the school year in prayer, and to focus on the school-wide theme for the 2013-14 academic year.

This year's theme "Worthy of the Call" is taken from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, and focuses on one of the four pillars of the St. Ed's mission statement; Excellence. Instead of seeing excellence as simply being about earning good grades, winning sports competitions, or achieving success in the fine arts, this year's theme challenges students to, in the words of St. Paul, "Live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace."

This year's theme is rooted in Moreau's own vision of excellence; "You must become identified with Jesus, your Model, not only becoming a faithful copy but in some way becoming another Christ." This year, at St. Ed's, the entire community is being challenged to heed the words of Moreau, and strive to live with Christ as our model, striving to live worthy of the call that God has for our lives.

Major Superiors of Men Urge Action on Syria

Brother William Mewes sends the following information including the message from the Conference of Major Superiors of Men Office of Justice and Peace.

Pope Francis: "[Catholics] have an obligation to get involved in politics. We can't play the role of Pontius Pilate and wash our hands of it. It's easy to blame others. But people need to ask themselves: 'Me? What am I doing about it?'"

If you are concerned about the situation in Syria, now is the time to get active about it.

Pope Francis has said "... my heart is deeply wounded in particular by what is happening in Syria and anguished by the dramatic developments which are looming. For this reason, brothers and sister, I have decided to call for a vigil for the whole Church." It will be "a day of fasting and prayer for peace in Syria, in the Middle East, and throughout the world." September 7th is that date and is the vigil of the birth of Mary, Queen of Peace. Make your plans now.

Bishop Richard E. Pates of Des Moines, who heads the U.S. Bishops' Committee on International Justice and Peace stated that the bishops' conference has long held "that the Syrian people urgently need a political solution that ends the fighting and creates a future for all Syrians, one that respects human rights and religious freedom."

Numerous Church leaders - including local bishops, Vatican officials and Pope Francis - have called for dialogue rather than military action in Syria.
