Brother James Patrick Sullivan, C.S.C. October 14, 1932 – May 12, 2014

Brother James Patrick Sullivan, C.S.C., age 81, died on May 12, 2014 at Memorial Hospital, in South Bend, Indiana. He was born in Chicago, Illinois on October 14, 1932, the son of Martin and Jane (Swaine) Sullivan. He attended St. Theodore Elementary School in Chicago, Illinois. At the age of 13 he persuaded his parents to let him be a Holy Cross Brother so in September 1946 he traveled to Sacred Heart Juniorate in Watertown, Wisconsin to begin high school studies and become a brother. In August 1949 he completed high school work and began his religious training at St. Joseph's Novitiate in Rolling Prairie, Indiana, where he pronounced his first vows as a Brother of Holy Cross on August 16, 1950. Brother James then went to Notre Dame to begin college studies and earned a bachelor's degree *cum laude* when he graduated in 1955.



He began his teaching career in 1952 when he joined the faculty at St. Anthony's High School in Long Beach, California. He then taught at St. Joseph's High School in South Bend, Indiana, Reitz Memorial High in Evansville and Archbishop Hoban High in Akron, Ohio. In 1962, Brother James was appointed principal of Cathedral High School in Indianapolis, where he served for 4 years. In 1966, he served as principal at Holy Cross High School in River Grove, Illinois. He then taught at Bishop David High in Louisville, Kentucky and Spalding College in Louisville for 6 years and then began graduate study in psychology at Indiana University. He was Executive Secretary of the Community College in Springfield, Illinois for two years and then psychologist for the Gary Community

School Association and Director of Counseling at Mendel High School in Chicago. His work as a psychologist continued in Chicago Heights and Oak Forest, Illinois. He served as the school psychologist for the Chicago Board of Education for 10 years and after a sabbatical he retired in Evergreen Park, Illinois but continued to work as an adjunct faculty member at Morton College in Cicero, IL and also tutored students at Aquinas Literacy Center in Chicago. In 2013 he joined the community at Columba Hall at Notre Dame.

Brother James was grateful for the bond of friendship among the members of his religious community and those he served in his ministry. He was a scholar in many fields and a fascinating conversationalist. He was engaging and witty, a person who seemed to never meet a stranger, he left a marked impression on those he met, especially in his correspondence with former students and colleagues in his ministries. He was interested in the intersection of theology and psychology and believed that the road to holiness passes through the world of action.

Visitation will be held on Saturday, May 17th, at St. Joseph's Chapel, on the grounds of Holy Cross Village at Notre Dame, at 9:30am with the Mass of Christian Burial at 10:30am and interment following in St. Joseph's Cemetery of the Village. Kaniewski Funeral Home is handling the arrangements.

84 Graduates in Holy Cross' 47th Commencement Ceremony



Holy Cross College, Notre Dame, IN, held their 47th Commencement Ceremony last Saturday, Saturday, May 10, in the McKenna Arena of the Pfeil Center at Holy Cross College. **Brother John Paige, C.S.C.**, President of Holy Cross College presented diplomas to a record number 109 students who graduated from Holy Cross including 21 who earned their degrees last December.

Kathleen Malone Beeler, former Chair of the Board of Beeler Industries, Elkhart, Indiana, and member of the Holy Cross Board of Trustees, was the keynote speaker at the 47th Commencement. She received an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters, *Honoris Causa* from the college. Kathleen Malone Beeler is well known in the Michiana area because of her enthusiasm and experience in education, fundraising, politics, board governance, and business leadership in the Michiana community.

Her daughter, Megan Beeler, 19, was a Notre Dame Freshman in January of 1982 when two Notre Dame Freshman members of the Notre Dame swimming team

died in a bus rollover on the Indiana Toll Road just two miles from Notre Dame while returning from a swimming meet against Northwestern.

Amy (DeCloedt) Nussbaum, a 2006 graduate of Holy Cross College, was the featured alumni speaker. An alumna of Mishawaka High School, in Mishawaka, Indiana, Ms. Nussbaum earned a Bachelor's Degree in Liberal Arts as a member of Holy Cross's second graduating baccalaureate class. She currently serves as the co-administrator, as well as a classroom directress, for the Countryside Montessori School, South Bend, Indiana.



Holy Cross College Honors Awarded March 28

Academic excellence was recently celebrated at Holy Cross College when the institution held its annual Honors Convocation. The event was held March 28 in St. Joseph's Chapel, on the campus of Holy Cross. Over 350 students, faculty, staff, and guests attended the ceremony, which honored those students named to the Dean's List during the spring 2013 and/or the fall 2014 semesters, as well as the Excellence in Teaching Award recipient, and four student Holy Cross Saints Award recipients.



Veteran, Holy Cross professor, **Edward Gareau**, was presented with the **Excellence in Teaching award**. Professor Gareau, a philosopher and theologian, began his teaching career 45 years ago. He has been a member of the Holy Cross faculty since 1994.

The 2014 Holy Cross Student Awards were presented to four students who exhibited excellence in the areas of academics, service, leadership, and character.

Holy Cross College awarded the **St. Thomas Aquinas Award for Academic Excellence** to senior, **Lavarr Barnett** (Ford Heights, IL). A business major, with a 3.89 GPA, Barnett is a member of the Delta Epsilon Sigma Honor Society preparing to study law at the University of Notre Dame this upcoming fall.

The **St. Joseph Service Award** was awarded to the Holy Cross student who most clearly exhibits a sincere dedication to serving others. The 2014 Recipient of the St. Joseph's Award was **Molly White** (Silver Spring, MD). Molly is a senior with a 3.5 GPA, majoring in business and psychology, with minors in communications and marketing. During her final semester at Holy Cross, Molly serves as student body president and is an honorary chair for the annual Homeward Bound 5K Walk and Run.

The **St. Sebastian Champions of Character Award** is awarded to the student athlete who most clearly exhibits the characteristics associated with the highest purposes of athletic participation, those of overall character development. The 2014 recipient of the St. Sebastian Award is Senior, **Nikolas Jelicic** (Sucuraj, Croatia). Jelicic has a 3.4 GPA, majoring in psychology, while earning minors in both business and sports management.

The All Saints Award for Excellence in Scholarship, Leadership, and Service was awarded to the student who most clearly exhibits the characteristics associated with the holistic educational mission of Holy Cross College. The 2014 Recipient of the All Saints Award is senior, **Thomas Lyons** (Valparaiso, IN). Thomas is majored in business, with minors in communications, marketing, and sports management. He is a member of the Delta Epsilon Sigma Honor Society with a 3.82 GPA.

A special honor was acknowledged during the 2014 convocation when Delta

Epsilon Sigma Honor Society announced that Holy Cross College student, **Claire Doriot** (Syracuse, IN) had been awarded the **J. Patrick Lee Prize in Service**.

The annual undergraduate competition was established this year to honor Patrick Lee, who served as National Secretary-Treasurer of **Delta Epsilon Sigma** with dedication and commitment for over 20 years, and whose leadership transformed the Society. The competition encourages student Delta Epsilon Sigma members to reflect on how their personal engagement in service reflects the tenets of Catholic social teaching and enriches the local, national, or global community, as well as ways in which they will continue or expand their service in the future.

Doriot, is a junior at Holy Cross majoring in Business and Theology with a 3.87 grade point average. She is involved in Mission Team, Student Government, and the St. Vincent de Paul Club.
