

Meet the Brothers Presentation



On Thursday, July 31, some 25 residents of Holy Cross Village gathered for an hour in the afternoon at Brother William Geenen Hall in Andre Place for a "Meet the Brothers" presentation organized by Village resident Ernest Brandewie. The event which is held occasionally is meant to better inform Village residents of the backgrounds of the Holy Cross Brothers who reside in Holy Cross Village.

This current presentation was made by **Brothers Edward Foken and Raymond Papenfuss**. After each brother spoke for about 20 minutes, questions were taken and answered.



Brother Edward, from the Cincinnati area of Ohio, spoke of those who influenced him to join the Brothers of Holy Cross, including his parents, pastor, and uncle, the late **Brother Walter Foken**.

outlined his

work as a missionary in Libera for 13 years as a teacher, principal (7 years) and school superintendent. Brother's last assignment was at St. Joseph High School in South Bend for 25 years. Brother was



one of the last brothers to serve at St. Joseph's. He has been active in the Dismas House program in South Bend since 2006, cooking twice a month for men and women living there who have recently been released from incarceration, and helping them obtain work.



Br. Raymond

Brother Raymond Papenfuss was born and grew up in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. He has been a Brother of Holy Cross for 61 years and just celebrated his 81st birthday. Brother Raymond knew at an early age he wanted to become a teacher and to work within the church. Raymond had no idea what a Brother was. His parish priest and two teachers from the public high school directed him to the Brothers of Holy Cross.

Much of Brother Raymond's presentation outlined his twenty-eight years in Ghana. In Ghana he taught, did some parish ministry, and worked at establishing a trade school. Brother also served as District Superior of the Brothers in Ghana. After an attack of cerebral malaria, he returned to the States. He then spent a year teaching at Holy Cross and St. Mary's Colleges, Notre

Dame, Indiana. He has had the good fortune to be able to work with the multiple handicapped communities in South Bend, Indiana. His heart is still firmly planted in West Africa, and he spends a good deal of time searching for funds to help develop our mission in Ghana. Brother currently serves as Assistant Provincial and Vicar of the Midwest Province of Brothers.


