



Hoban's Revolutionary War Days Program

Word has gotten out about Hoban's Revolutionary War Days program. For several years now, Jason Anderson, an American history teacher at Akron's Archbishop Hoban High School, has presented a reenactment program for hundreds of elementary students about the Revolutionary War, complete with horses, muskets and period costumes.



Now, the Mount Vernon Ladies' Association in Virginia is making it possible for him to take the program on the road three times--once in Columbus, once in Marietta and once in Cincinnati.

Twenty-four Hoban students presented a four-hour program for 275 elementary students and the general public on the grounds of the Ohio Statehouse in Columbus Sept. 28-29. Stations included an enlistment tent for the Continental Army, a kitchen of the day, a printing press, medical tools of the time and drilling practice for a fife and drum corps. All expenses were covered by the Mount Vernon Ladies' Association.

The program travels to Marietta in October and to Cincinnati in April.

Schubert/Dujarie/Quinn Kitchen Renovation Completed

The month-long kitchen renovation in Schubert Villa/Dujarie House/Quinn Center has been completed on schedule by October 1. For a month all meals were prepared in the Andre Place kitchen and trucked to Schubert Villa. The Sodexo staff of 50 cooks and waiters were able to keep the 24-7 operation running smoothly.

Chef Scott Beckam of the Schubert Villa kitchen was very pleased with the renovation. Scott said, “The new configuration along with new preparation counters allow for much more room and an even flow for plating resident’s dining orders.” The changes allow meals to be served to a larger resident community than the original kitchen configuration allowed.



New additions to the kitchen included an extended oven hood and exhaust fan allowing for a cooler operating environment, a new oven, small refrigeration units, counters, dishwasher, shelving and numerous small utensils.

Here is an update on health issues for several of our Brothers who are asking to be remembered in prayer:

- **Brother Bernard Klim** was scheduled for surgery on Tuesday, October 7th, to remove his spleen. Bernie is receiving treatment for a rare blood disorder, and the splenectomy is advised to address complicating effects.
- **Brother Gerald Nettesheim** is scheduled for surgery on his lower back to address a pinched nerve which causes significant problems in walking. Surgery is set for Wednesday, October 8th, and it is anticipated there will be a period of rehabilitation to follow at Dujarie House.
- **Brother James Reddy** has recently been diagnosed with a type of cancer in his lower jaw. James has decided to pursue aggressive treatment, and begins chemotherapy this week.
- **Brother Paul Kelly** reports that his course of chemotherapy to address a form of leukemia has concluded. The doctors appear to be satisfied with the results, but Paul will continue to follow a slower pace of life including afternoon rest periods.
- **Brother Tim O'Connell** has returned to his apartment in the Village following a period of rehabilitation in Dujarie House. Tim now navigates around the Village with the assistance of a scooter due to problems with neuropathy, but is glad to be home.
- **Brother Roger Berg** continues to make progress in rehabilitation at Dujarie due to recent surgery on both knees. Roger begrudgingly admits the progress is slow, but he is now able to take steps with the aid of a walker in therapy sessions.

- **Brother James Blazek** reports that he is again experiencing lymphatic leukemia, and has begun a course of treatment requiring daily medications. James is being encouraged to follow a reduced schedule of activity.
- **Brother John Stout** continues in rehabilitation at Dujarie while regaining strength following a period of hospitalization for heart and breathing problems. John is making excellent progress and is hopeful of returning to his Schubert Villa residence within the next few weeks.
- **Brother Donald Fleischhacker** is now at Dujarie House following a week of hospitalization due to the shingles and an infection. Don's condition is improving slowly, and he is appreciative all who remember him prayer.
- **Brother Henry Skitzki** has been discharged from Dujarie House after treatment for an infection. Henry is now at his residence at Riverside Place, and the doctors continue to monitor his condition.
- And lastly, **Brother Richard Gilman** is scheduled for discharge from Dujarie House tomorrow. Richard's hip replacement was a success, and he is experiencing less pain and moving more quickly, currently with the assistance of a walker.
