Brother Robert Lavelle, C.S.C., is honored by the Gilmour Community / Family



On Saturday, April 18, 2015, Brother Robert Lavelle, C.S.C., was recognized, thanked and honored for his 38 years of service to Gilmour Academy. Thirty-four of those years he served as Headmaster of the school.

The event was held in the Gilmour Academy Athletic Facility which was transformed into the Eastside & Westside of Cleveland with familiar restaurants from the respective sides of town for “Gilmour’s Night in the CLE”.

Many accolades were rightly given to Brother Robert as well as “thank you” by numerous people. The booklet said it well:



Brother Robert was the eighth headmaster of Gilmour Academy and is one of the longest serving headmasters, of an independent school in the U.S. He will continue

Retirement Fund For Religious



On the weekend of April 11& 12, 2015, **Brothers William Mewes and Roy Smith** spoke at Little Flower Parish, South Bend, IN, and St. Thomas Parish, Elkhart, IN.

In 1988 the Catholic bishops in the United States launched the Retirement Fund for Religious (RFR) to address significant lack of retirement funding for Catholic sisters, brothers and priests in religious orders. Three primary factors fueling the crisis are: insufficient retirement savings, rising health-care costs, and declining income.

The Midwest Province has been a part of sharing the above message with members of the Diocese of Ft. Wayne-South Bend many times since the campaign fund was initiated over 25 years ago.

This slow deterioration of our memory can be very subtle or can come on rapidly so we may have difficulty functioning as independently as we once did.


