Brother Tom Rock is Attacked

Riverside Place residents are fortunate to have Brother Tom Rock as a neighbor. He regularly treats them to a car wash and other services. His garden, carved from the woods over the years, is a source of beauty and pride. It was recently featured in the first garden walk of the village showing off residents' beautiful summer flowers.

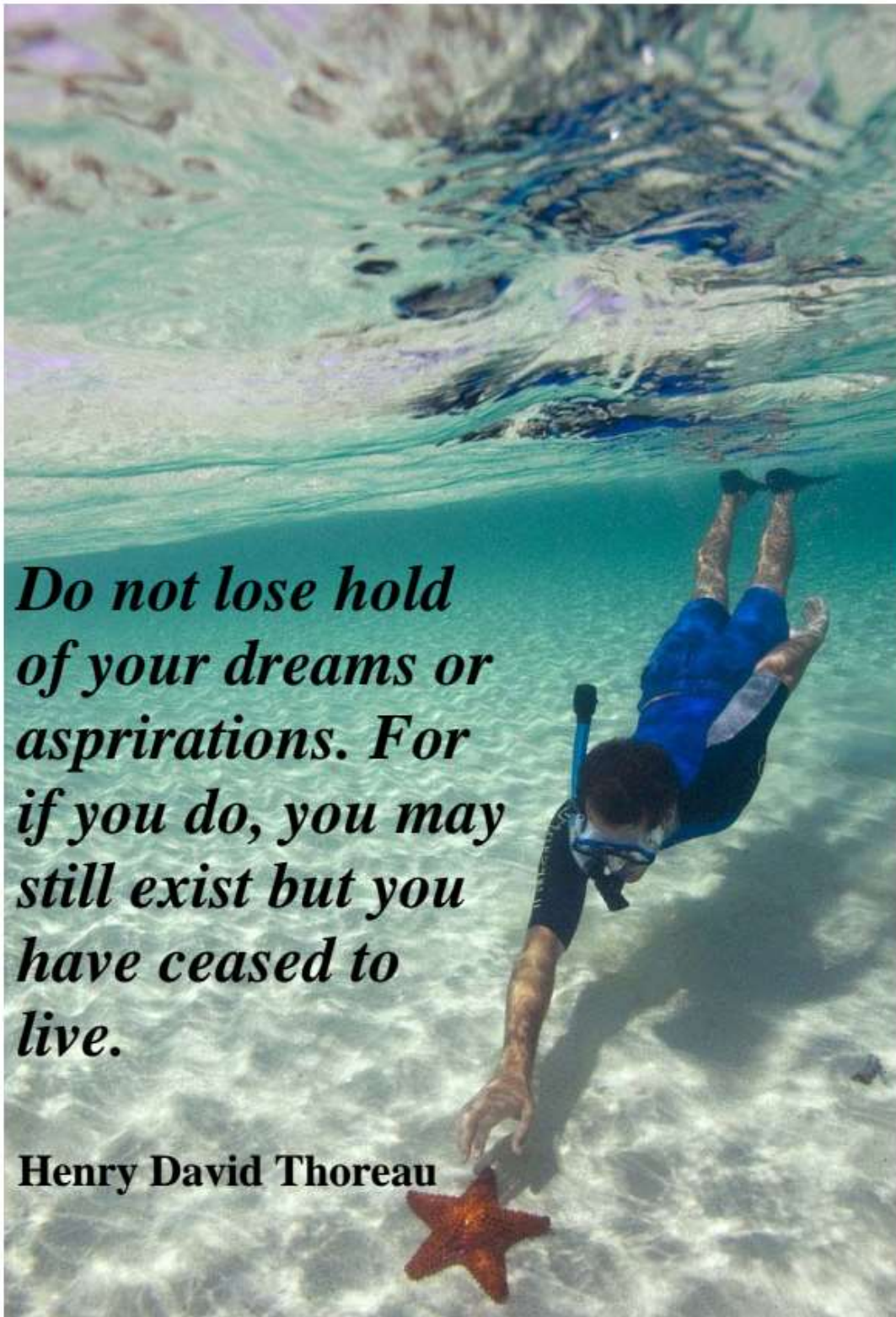
But recently Tom's garden came under attack by a giant hogweed — no laughing matter. Listed as a Federal Noxious Weed under the Plant Protection Act, which makes it illegal in the U.S. to import, export, or transport it between States without a permit (USDA, APHIS - Noxious Weeds Program), *Heracleum mantagazzium* is native to the Caucasus and can cause severe blistering and even blindness., even though it is a member of the parsnip family. Only a quick application of soap and water saved Tom. The plant came to the U.S. in 1917. (So Holy Cross was here first in 1841!) Specialists were called in to remove the invader.



But residents are now alert to the threat and have their eyes tightly focused. It is rumored that there may be three infant plants out there. Riverside residents though are eager to come to Tom's defense. We and our cars need him. We are crediting Saint Isidore (and not Father Moreau) for the deliverance. Isidore is the patron saint of farmers.

The following is an update on various health problems which some of our members are experiencing as they ask to be remembered in prayer:

- 1) **Brother Greg Teodecki** suffered a mild stroke last week, and is now at Saint Joseph Rehabilitation Institute receiving intensive physical therapy. - 2) **Brother James Reddy** has begun a new routine of chemotherapy in response to recently discovered swollen lymphoids in the abdomen. This is Jim's third course of treatments related to Non-Hodgkin lymphoma. Jim continues to reside at Columba Hall and is tolerating the chemotherapy better than expected.
- 3) **Brother James Kumba** is currently receiving physical therapy at Wellbrooke of South Bend to address mobility issues related to weakness in his leg. Wellbrooke (recently opened and just up the road from Notre Dame) as Dujarie House does not have an open rehab bed. Besides the therapy sessions, Jim is greatly enjoying the new environment, the various social activities, and the opportunity to meet many new people.

- 4) **Brother John Ptaszek** was hospitalized last week due to low-blood sugar complications and treatment of an infection. John is now back at Columba Hall with the infection treated, but with the blood sugars still fluctuating without a known cause. The doctors continue to run tests, and the Columba Hall nursing staff is closely monitoring his sugar intake and levels.
- 5) **Brother Roberto Jimenez** was involved in an automobile accident last week. He was hit by a speeding car being chased by a second vehicle. Roberto's car was totaled in the accident, and he suffered a bruised arm and strained knee, both initially requiring soft casts. Fortunately Robert is recovering and managed to maintain most of his responsibilities at the parish.
